OFFENSE - The Rattlers returned 8 offensive starters LY and went from #8 to #1 in scoring and from #7 to #2 in total offense. They return 10 starters and will be in the 2nd yr under HC Joe Taylor. Last year FAMU had to replace its top 2 QB's who combined for 1,220 yds but returned QB Eddie Battle, who threw for 537 (58.7%) with a 4-3 ratio in '07, and added Kentucky transfer QB Curtis Pulley (PS#19). They split time LY with Battle throwing for 963 (62.9%) and a 4-4 ratio, while Pulley was 1st Tm MEAC, throwing for 1,382 (55.1%) with a 17-5 ratio and was also the top rusher (885, 4.5, 7 TD). This year they both return. FAMU lost 3 of its top 4 rushers LY but returned #1 rusher, MEAC ROY RB Phillip Sylvester (858, 5.7, 7 TD). The Rattlers return 2nd Tm MEAC RB Sylvester (717, 4.3, 8 TD) along with his top blocker, starting FB Mykel Benson. The Rattlers returned 2 of top 4 rec LY in #2 WR Jarvis Funderburk (258, 11.2) and #3 WR Adrian Smith (242, 12.1). They avg 40 ypg more passing and finished #3 in passing offense. FAMU loses Funderburk (1 rec) and 2nd Tm MEAC TE Taj Jenkins (159, 12.2) but returns their top 4 rec including WR's 1st Tm MEAC Kevin Elliott (817, 14.1, 7 TD), Isaac West (636, 18.2) and Smith (445, 13.9, 6 TD). The OL returned 4 starters LY and improved the ypc from 4.1 to 4.4 finishing #5 in rushing while allowing 27 sacks. TY they return all 5 starters led by 1st Tm MEAC RT Robert Okeafor and 2nd Tm MEAC LG Anthony Collins.

DEFENSE - FAMU returned 6 defensive starters LY and 3 of top 4 tklr but lost starting CB Michael Creary to a preseason inj. The Rattlers moved up from #7 to #6 in scoring but despite allowing 26 ypg less and remained #8 in total defense. They return 9 starters and 9 of their top 11 tklr and also get back Creary. The DL returned 2 starters LY allowed 90 ypg less rushing (ypc 5.0 to 4.0) with 27 sacks. FAMU returns all 4 starters led by 2nd

Tm MEAC DT Cameron Houston (#6 tklr, 12 tfl, 4) and DE Draymenski Wilson (#9 tklr, 4 tfl). The LB unit had to replace the #2 tklr LY but returned 2 starters including 2nd Tm MEAC Vernon Wilder (#1 tklr, 5 sk). The Rattlers must replace Wilder (#8 tklr) but return their top 2 tklr in Bryan Parker (68 tkl, 12.5 tfl), who led with 8 sacks, and Alvis Graham (66 tkl, 10.5 tfl). The secondary (with the loss Creary) returned just 1 starter and allowed 61 ypg more passing to finish last in pass defense, but only allowed a 17-16 ratio. FAMU loses S Jason Beach (#3 tklr) but returns 3 starters in 2nd Tm MEAC CB Curtis Holcomb (#10 tklr, 5 int, 13 pbu), CB Qier Hall (#7 tklr, 45 tkl, 5 int, 6 pbu) and FS Greg Harvey (#4 tklr). They also return Creary, who looks have moved from CB to SS.

SPECIAL TEAMS - FAMU had to replace an all-time great in K/P Wesley Taylor LY. The unit had a Div-I rec 10 return TD's led by AA KR/PR LeRoy Vann, who avg 29.5 on KR (3 TD) and 16.5 on PR (3 TD) and set NCAA ssn record for comb ret yards with 1,599. PK Trevor Scott hit on 12 of 20 (L/43) but had 3 kicks blk'd LY. The only loss is P Will Platt (36.0).

COACHES - HC Joseph "Joe" Taylor enters his second season at FAMU after coming over from Hampton. His overall record is 206-79-4 in 27 yrs and he became the 9th HBCU coach to surpass 200-wins over his career. Taylor's OC George Small also is the OL cch. The co-DCs are Earl Holmes who is LB cch and Timothy Edwards.

FORECAST - The Rattlers have had just 2 losing seasons in the last 15 years but their last playoff trip was in 2001 where they lost to Georgia Southern 60-35 and have only had 9 postseason trips since 1978. FAMU returns 21 starters, including two AA and 7 All-MEAC performers. They should challenge for the MEAC crown this year but must find a way to get past Delaware St (0-4 since '05) and South Carolina St (0-6 since '02) to take it.
