

# OKLAHOMA STATE COWBOYS

## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2009

**QUARTERBACKS** - In 2005 OSU's 3 QB's combined for 49.4% with an 11-17 ratio. Bobby Reid (PS#5) won the job in '06 and was #3 in NCAA in pass eff after 8 but struggled in the final 4 of the regular season and threw for 2,266 (55%) with a 24-11 ratio. Reid was the starter into '07 but Zac Robinson took over and set the school record for single season total offense with 3,671. Robinson threw for 2,824 (60%) with a 23-9 ratio (847 rush, 6.1). Last year the only question was would his backup be soph Alex Cate (PS#17) or Brandon Weeden (6'4" 215 So) who spent 5 years as a minor league baseball pitcher. Weeden was a #2DC of the Yankees and obviously has a powerful arm. Cate played in 4 (5 att) and Weeden in 1 (3 att). Robinson threw for 3,064 (65%) with a 25-10 ratio while rushing for 562 (3.8) and already holds the OSU record for total offense with 7,786 (Mike Gundy, 7749). Not listed in the PSL below is Brayden Stringer (6'4" 206 rFr). Robinson should have improved numbers once again.

**RUNNING BACKS** - OSU has had some great RB's like Barry Sanders, Thurman Thomas and Terry Miller. Tatum Bell (#2DC) topped 1,000 in each of his last 2 years and Vernand Morency (#3DC) rushed for 1,474 (5.7) in '04. In '07 the job was a battle between Kendall Hunter (PS#116) and Dantrell Savage (PS#11JC). Savage had 10 straight 100 yard games finishing with 1,272 (5.7). Hunter had 696 (6.5). Last year they had to replace Savage but added Beau Johnson (5'10" 210 Sr, PS#7JC). Johnson rushed for just 357 (6.2). Keith Toston, who had 631 (6.0) in '06 but missed most of '07 (ACL), had 686 (6.7). The star of the unit was FWAA AA Hunter who rushed for 1,555 (6.5) with 16 TD's. His best B12 game was 161 at #1 Texas. Not listed below are Michael Roberts (5'9" 186 Jr), Taylor Sokolosky (5'9" 190 Jr) and FB's Travis Miller (5'9" 189 rFr) and John Toben (6'1" 239 So). The great news is everyone returns and keep an eye on rFr Kyle Staley (PS#14), whose nickname is Ron because he has a running style like Ron Dayne, and true fresh Dexter Pratt (PS#20) who was in for the spring.

**RECEIVERS** - Rashaun Woods set the school's career receiving mark in 2003 (#1DC). His brother, D'Juan Woods, became the feature WR in '05 and led with 879 (15.7) while the #2 had just 238 (14.9). Woods ret'd in '06 and they got the outstanding addition of NC transfer Adarius Bowman (6'4", PS#16). Bowman set a school record with 300 yds rec vs Kan and had 1,181 (19.7). Woods' numbers dropped to 647 (15.8) while TE Brandon Pettigrew had 310 (12.9). In '07 they had to replace Woods. Bowman missed 2 (inj) but still led with 1,006 (15.0). True frosh Dez Bryant (PS#5) emerged and had 622 (14.5). TE Pettigrew finished with 540 (15.4). Last year they had to replace Bowman and then lost Pettigrew for 3 to inj. Bryant led with 1,480 (17.0) and 19 TD's including a Holiday Bowl record 13 rec (167 yds) while Pettigrew had 472 (11.2). A #2 WR did not really emerge until late when Damian Davis had 5 for 79 vs Okla and finished #3 with 414 (21.8). Pettigrew moves on (#1DC DET) and Davis and Jeremy Broadway (118 yd) were dismissed. One of the year's best stories, WR Artrell Woods transferred (1 rec after major inj). Everyone else is back and while there are a few big losses, this group could be just as strong. The big question is who will be #2 to Bryant? Not listed in the PSL are TE's Ben Bailey (6'2" 224 Jr), Dylan Brown (6'1" 210 Jr), Perry Watson (6'0" 185 rFr) and WR's Bryce Hood (5'9" 185 So), Isaiah Anderson (5'10" 175 rFr, PS#146), Colton Chelf (5'10" 180 Jr), Josh Cooper (5'11" 185 So, PS#74) and Nathan Gleisleder (6'3" 202 Sr).

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - In 2007 the Cowboys basically had just 2 starters back but improved to 243 rush ypg (5.3) while allowing just 11 sacks. Last year they had to replace a 2nd Tm B12 LG but had 9 of their top 10 back and improved to 245 ypg (5.5) with 16 sacks (4.9%). This year they lose C David Washington (13 st, 3Y

st', would've been 4 if not inj'd), RG Steve Denning (13 st, 2Y st'r) and backups OT Trent Perkins and G Andrew Lawrence. They return 1st Tm Big 12LT Russell Okung and add PS#4JC Anthony Morgan (IFS) and PS#22 Brandon Webb. While this unit is a little less experienced than the 2008 version, they should be one of the top OL's in the B12 as they return 91 career starts.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - OSU had 7 of its top 8 back in 2006 and went from allowing 4.9 ypc to 4.0 and was #8 in the FBS in tfl's. In 2007 they had to replace all 4 starters and as expected, the numbers slipped to 4.2 ypc rush allowed and the sacks dropped from 37 to 22. Last year they had to replace 3 starters but did add a couple of JUCO's. While they trimmed the ypg rush allowed to 138 (4.3), they only recorded 15 sacks. This year they lose DT Tonga Tea (7 st, 22 tkl, 2 sk, HM B12), DT Jeray Chatham (7 st, 15 tkl, 2 tfl) and Quency Patrick (4 tkl). OSU opened in a 3-4 in six of their 13 games. This year they have two returning starters plus two others who combined for 6 starts making it the most experienced unit in 3 years and again add a couple of JUCO's and some rFr.

**LINEBACKERS** - The Cowboys have had experienced LB corps the last few years. Last year they had to replace one starter (#1 tkl'r) and four players who combined for six starts and 111 tackles. OSU moved starting SS Andre Sexton to LB and ret'd its #2 tackler. This year they only lose Seb Clements (15 tkl) and Jared Glover (5 tkl). They return their #1, #2 and #4 tacklers who each started all 13 as well as their #7 and #9 tacklers and the 2 deep includes 4 VHT's. This should be one of the top LB corps in the Big 12.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - After finishes of #98 ('05) and #80 ('06) they had 7 of their top 8 back in '07 and nine DB's with FBS starting experience. It was surprising the more experienced unit dropped to #92. CB Jacob Lacey became the first OSU player to have 3 int's in a game since Tony Banfield (1959). Last year they only had to replace one starter and 3 backups and I called for OSU to have its best pass D rankings in at least 4 years. The Cowboys lost Lucien Antoine (PS#37JC) in Wk 2 (1 st) to an ACL inj but climbed to #64. This year they lose 2nd Tm B12 CB Lacey (13 st, 61 tkl, 2 int, 14 pbu), SS Ricky Price (13 st, 81 tkl, 1 int, 7 pbu), FS Quinton Moore (12 st, 70 tkl, 3 pbu) and TJ Bell (5 st, 18 tkl). Two VHT JC's signed last year but this group is much less experienced and is my biggest concern on the 2009 squad.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - The Cowboys finished #3, #18 and #11 in ST coord's Joe DeForest's first 3 years and added a #19 finish in '06. Surprisingly in '07 the group dropped to #70. Last year with almost everyone back I said they should make a solid

climb. Dez Bryant avg a super 17.9 per PR while Perrish Cox improved his KR avg to 29.8 (21.5 '07). Dan Bailey hit 15 of 19 FG's (2 miss from 50+, long 45) while Matt Fodge avg 42.9 (net 39.1). Overall the unit improved to #14. This year they lose P Fodge but could finish close to last year's solid ranking.

**COACHES** - Mike Gundy was a star QB here and later was the QB coach and OC in the early '90's. He ret'd here in '01 as the asst HC and OC and took over as HC in '05. Gundy, at 38, was the youngest HC in the NCAA in '05 but he had paid his dues with 15 years as a full-time asst. Last year he had to replace OC Larry Fedora, who left to be HC at SM. He went with co-OC's in Trooper Taylor and Gunter Brewer (QB coach). Gundy called the plays in the '07 bowl and all of last year and put a lot of faith in his DC Tim Beckman as at times in '08 he worked on the next offensive series away from the field. This year he loses Taylor (Aub) and Beckman, who became the HC at Toledo. He made a great hire in Bill Young who is in his 3rd stint at OSU (last here in '78). He was the DC at Miami LY, Kansas from '02-'07 and also the DC at Ohio St, Oklahoma and USC.

## PHIL'S FORECAST

OSU had 51 returning lettermen in '03 including their big 3 off players in QB Fields, RB Bell and WR Woods. They were ranked #24 in the preseason (not ranked S/'85) and opened the season 7-1 before finishing a solid 9-4. In '04 they had to replace the big 3 but RB Morency rushed for 1,474 and the Cowboys recorded their 3rd straight winning year after having just 1 in the previous 12. They blew a 35-14 lead vs Texas and despite a 5-0 start, finished just 7-5 benefiting from +16 turnovers. In '05, despite a weak non-conf schedule, I mentioned the possibility of a losing season. They opened up 3-0 but were hardly impressive vs three weak foes. Colo dealt them their first shutout in 14 years (34-0). The Cowboys lost 7 of their last 8 to finish 4-7. In 2006 they had 9 starters back on off. They finished 7-6 with 4 close losses decided on the final play. In 2007 the Cowboys had 8 off starters back including their top QB, RB and WR from the 4th most productive offense in school history so expectations were raised much like in 2003. Their 15 ret starters tied for tops in the Big 12 but they did have 5 road games vs teams that went to bowls in '06. When they beat Indiana in the bowl they matched 2006's record at 7-6 and it was the first time they recorded B2B bowl wins since 1987 when Gundy was the QB with RB Thomas and WR Hart Lee Dykes. Last year the Cowboys had to replace 28 of 62 lettermen (45%) and played in the same division as three top 10 teams yet I still called for them to top 2007's win total. OSU blew out their first 5 foes including bowl bound Houston & Troy. Despite being 5-0, they were a 2 TD dog at #3 Missouri. OSU pulled the upset 28-23 which had them 6-0 for the first time since 1945. This after Gundy's first 3 years were a combined 18-19. In a letdown spot the next week, they still blasted Baylor 34-6 and rose to #7. They took on #1 Texas on the road and only lost by 4. After waxing Iowa they took on #2 TT on the road, one week after Tech's upset of Texas. This time they were destroyed 56-20 with TT having a 629-368 yd edge. After beating Colo they took on their 4th Top 3 team of the season and lost to Okla 61-41 in a game that was closer than the final. In their bowl, they led 17-7 at half but lost 42-31 with QB Robinson, RB Hunter and WR Bryant all banged up. However, their 9-4 finish was their best since 2003 (9-4 also). Despite facing those 4 Top 10 teams, the Cowboys were +25.6 in Big 12 play (6th best). This year OSU returns another version of the triplets in QB Robinson, RB Hunter (1st Tm AA) and WR Bryant (1st Tm AA). They did have only 2 starts lost in 2008. The Cowboys have shown remarkable balance as in '07 they had 3,161 rush and 3,161 pass and last year the balance was 3,191-3,149. OSU set a school single season ticket record at 39,976. OSU has not had a double digit winning season since 1988 (20 years) but I'll call for one this year as the D should be much improved with new DC Young and the offense is among the nation's best.

Cowboys have won 13 straight home openers (last loss was in '95 vs Nebraska). Oklahoma St has won 15 straight non-conf home games by an avg of 33 ppg.

LY OSU had 699 yds (2nd highest single-gm mark in school history, 717 vs KU in '88). Not only did all 3 of OSU's FBS non-conf opp's make it to bowls LY, they all won.

Cowboys 3 reg ssn losses LY were vs schools ranked #1 (UT), #2 (TT) & #3 (OU). OSU is 2-0-1 vs Rice posting B2B shutouts, but the last meeting was in 1923.

First meeting. Oklahoma St is 22-5-1 all-time vs FCS opponents (last loss in 1949). Tigers finished 11-2 LY (lost to NV) as they took home their 22nd SWAC Title.

Last yr's win snapped a 4 game losing streak as OSU scored 5 off, 2 def & 1 ST TD's. The Cowboys are just 8-16 in their L/24 road games losing by an avg of 19 ppg.

Last yr these 2 came in avg 105 combined offensive pts as OSU pulled the upset. Oklahoma St is 26-12-2 on Homecoming since 1969 (45-37-1 on HC all-time).

Mike Gundy spent the '96 season as the BU QB's coach & passing gm coordinator. These 2 have avg'd 69 ppg the L9Y (lowest tll 40 pts LY). OSU has won 12 of 13 vs BU.

OSU is 2-21 vs UT (1-12 in B12 & L/win was in '97 (42-16). With a 23-yr run in the 2Q LY vs UT, Hunter became just the 2nd OSU Fr RB to top 1,000 yds in a ssn (T. Thomas).

The visitor in this series is 5-12-2 since 1984. OSU has dropped 3 of L/5 vs ISU. In last year's 59-17 blowout WR Bryant had 9 rec's for 171 yds & 4 TD's.

Cowboys surrendered a ssn high 629 yds to TT LY, 2nd yr in a row gave up ssn high in yds to TT (718 in '07). These potent offenses have avg 68 ppg S/'99. The HT has won 7 straight.

Oklahoma St is just 3-11 since 1989 vs Colorado w/ the avg score CU 29-18. Including 3 straight losses, OSU is just 7-12-1 in their home finale since 1989.

With 2 TD rec LY vs OU, Bryant broke Rashaun Woods OSU single-ssn record (17 in '02). Gundy was 0-4 vs OU as OSU's starting QB from 1986-'89 (0-8 combined as QB/HC).

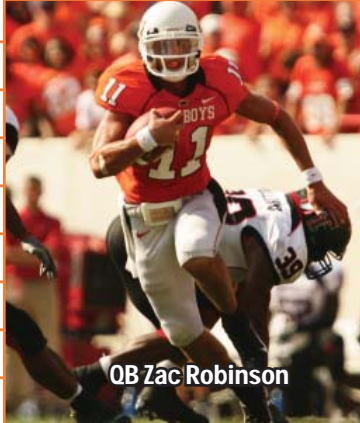
