

TCU HORNED FROGS

POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2009

QUARTERBACKS - Jeff Ballard (PS#44) won 90.5% of his starts ('05-'06) and set numerous school and MWC records. Marcus Jackson (PS#74) filled in well for Ballard when he was injured early in '06 throwing for 386 (59.1%) with a 2-1 ratio. In '07 rF Andy Dalton (PS#74) beat out Jackson (1 st, 8 gm). Dalton threw for 2,459 (59.8%) with a 10-11 ratio (#4, 232 rush) and broke TCU's single season comp record (207, Max Knake 1993) with 222 and was bowl MVP. Jackson threw for 368 (50.7%) with a 3-1 ratio (187 rush). Last year the #3 QB was true frosh Yogi Gallegos (travel sqd) who Patterson wanted to RS. Dalton had a career high 17 rush att in the opener. Jackson played late vs SMU (gm 4) and had a 79 yd TD run. Dalton inj'd his knee in the 4Q vs Okla (gm 5) and Jackson started vs SDSU (131 rush) and Colo St. WR Jeremy Kerley saw plenty of action in the Wild Frog Offense incl rushing for 77 vs BYU (Dalton started). Dalton finished the season with 2,242 (59.3%) and improved his ratio to 11-5 (432 rush) while once again winning bowl MVP. Jackson threw for 372 (56.5%), 384 rush). Even with this school producing QB's like Sammy Baugh and Davey O'Brien, Dalton is already the #3 career leading passer and had a stretch of 108 passes without an int LY. True frosh VHT Casey Pachall (PS#27) was in for the spring. Not listed in the PSL below is Kyle Wilson (6'1" 200 rF). Jackson spent time at both S and QB in spring but Dalton already has 17 career wins in 2 years.

RUNNINGBACKS - TCU's most famous alum is LaDainian Tomlinson, who rushed for over 4,000 yards in his last 2 years here and went on to NFL stardom. In 2006 soph Aaron Brown led with 801 (5.2). Lonta Hobbs (#1 rush '02) returned midyear and had 665 (4.6). In '07 TCU lost their top 2 RB's to injury again as Brown (fastest) missed 4 and Joseph Turner (PS#163) missed 3 but finished with 226 vs SDSU and led with 597 (5.2). Ryan Christian (321, 3.6) and Justin Watts (204, 3.6) filled in. Last year Turner (powerback) was only 85% to start the season and was banged up often. He rushed for 577 (4.0). Brown was susp'd the first 3 and rushed for 547 (5.5) including 102 in the bowl. Christian added 386 (4.2) and rF Jai Cavness (PS#173) added 134 (4.3). This year they lose Brown (5 st, #6DC DET) and Justin Watts (2 st, 175 tl yd). Not listed in the 3 deep below are Cavness (5'8" 175 So), Chris Smith (5'11" 231 Sr, PS#128), Jercell Fort (5'11" 175 So), two solid true frosh in Waymon James (PS#80) and Matthew Tucker (PS#96) and FB's Luke Shivers (6'0" 220 So) and Ryan Hightower (5'9" 215 Jr).

RECEIVERS - TCU had to replace their top receiver (514 in '07 and then lost #2 rec Donald Massey so the top returnees were 6'4" Walter Bryant (337, 12.5) and Jimmy Young (325, 14.1). TE Shae Reagan was 261 lbs (4.6 spd) and an NFL prospect but had an injury-plagued career. He had 237 (13.2) in '08. RB Ryan Christian also played WR and was #2 with 321 (10.7). Jeremy Kerley (also played QB) had 95 (8.6). The top WR by far was soph Jimmy Young who had 988 (16.7). Young set a school record with 226 vs WY (most rec yd by MWC ply'r in '08). Bryant had 298 (11.0). This year they must replace Bryant (11 st), Reagan (10 st) and Massey. Not listed in the 3 deep below are Billy Pizor (6'0" 175 Jr), John Brown (6'0" 180 Jr) and Robert Deck (6'4" 255 So). I look for a bigger impact from Texas transfer Antoine Hicks (PS#38DB) who had just 7 rec as a true and with their top guy back, this unit looks stronger, even with the loss of a top-notch TE.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '06 TCU had to replace 4 starters with the only returnee being 1st Tm MWC Herbert Taylor (3Y st r). Surprisingly the young group improved to 4.5 ypc rushing while allowing a MWC low 15 sacks (4.3%). In '07 they had to replace Taylor (#6DC) and 2 other starters. The numbers dropped to 165 ypg (3.7) with the sacks rising to 23 (5.2%). Last year the OL had 4 starters back although OT Nic Richmond (13 st '07) lost his job (2 st). In the preseason Patterson thought they could be as good as the '06 unit (4.5 ypc). Their most experienced O-line in a few years opened holes for 220 ypp rush (best S/00) and 4.5 ypc

while allowing just 18 sacks (4.9%). This year they lose 1st Tm MWC C Blake Schlueter (13 st, 3Y st r, #7DC DEN), RG Giles Montgomery (13 st, 2Y st r), LG Preston Phillips (8 st), OG Heath Raetz (4 gm) and RG Josh Karlin (1 gm, inj). They have 2 huge tackles in 6'5" 350 lb Marcus Cannon (HM MWC) and 6'3" 317 lb Marshall Newhouse (2nd Tm MWC) and while this unit is slightly less experienced, it can still be one of the MWC's top units.

DEFENSIVE LINE - Patterson always fields a top-notch D-line and they have yielded 2.9 or less ypc rushing in 9 of the last 10 years. The only year they did not was 2004 (still only 3.2) when they had to replace all 4 starters. In '06 they had the outstanding DE combo of Tommy Blake and Chase Ortiz returning (16 sk '05). TCU allowed 61 ypp rush and 2.2 ypc (then-best under Patterson) while the team recorded 36 sacks. In '07 star DE Blake missed 5 and was not 100%. Also DT James Vess missed the year. TCU's numbers dropped to 103 ypp (2.9) with 41 sacks. Last year I listed them as having 3 starters back and one of them, NT Kelly Griffin (13 st '07) lost his job. They led the NCAA allowing 47 ypp rush and a paltry 1.7 ypc, recording 43 sacks. The star was 1st Tm AA DE Jerry Hughes (15 sk, #1 NCAA). This year they lose 3 starters including two 2nd Tm MWC players in DE Matt Panfil (13 st, 31 tkl, 4.5 sk) and NT Cody Moore (13 st, 25 tkl, 6 sk, 1 int) as well as DT Vess (900 lb squat, 13 st, 22 tkl) and backup DT John Fonua (5 tkl). New DE Braylon Broughton was LY's MWC preseason Frosh of the Year (orig signed Ariz) but played in just 3 while DT Wayne Daniels (PS#57) was a DE last year. You know Patterson will field one of the top D-lines in the league but this group is less experienced.

LINEBACKERS - TCU runs a 4-2-5 and all of their S are legitimate Saf's but I'll list the SS here. Robert Henson had 3 career starts heading into '08 but was HM MWC in each of his first 3 years and was the #5 tkl'r in '07. Patterson said it was the best group of LB's he'd had in 11 years. SS Stephen Hodge led the FBS in DB sacks with 8. Jason Phillips was MWC preseason Def POY and led in tackles (#2 in tfl). Probably the most athletic of the LB's was Daryl Washington who finished #4. This year they lose three 1st Tm MWC players in Henson (12 st, #3 tkl'r, #6DC WAS), Phillips (12 st, #1 tkl'r, #5DC BAL) and Hodge (13 st, #2 tkl'r, 10 tfl, #6DC DAL). I like the talent as Washington will be the #1 tackler and Cordera Hunter and Marcus Jackson (QB & S in spg) are a solid duo at SS while true frosh Tanner Brock is the first VHT LB here since 2003 (Devon Davis). This is one of the MWC's best LB corps, but with a few notches from last year's tremendous group with three NFL draft picks.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - TCU traditionally finishes high in my pass D rankings including a #4 finish in '06 (despite 3 new str). In '07 they only had to replace 1 starter and finished #9. Last year they had to replace 2 starters but ret both 2Y starting CB's and climbed to #2. This year they only lose 2nd Tm MWC FS Steven Coleman (13 st, 46 tkl, 3 int, 10 pbu). They add in Okla signee Malcolm Williams (PS#29JC) and LSU signee Jason Teague. This is one of the best secondaries in the country with the most exp set of CB's in the NCAA (78 car sts between them).

SPECIAL TEAMS - TCU almost always produces a top-notch ST unit under Patterson. In the last 8 years they finished in the Top 35 six times including #2 in '07. They have had a 1st Tm All-Conf returnman for 4 straight years. Last year they had to replace PR Brian Bonner (1st Tm MWC in '06 & '07) but Patterson said Jeremy Kerley would be even better. While Kerley was banged up in the 2H, he still had 25 PR (13.9). Aaron Brown was my 1st Tm MWC KR in '08 (29.2). They did have to replace both their outstanding P and K. True frosh Ross Evans (PS#56) was the only frosh on the Lou Groza semi-finalist list hitting 12 straight FG's finishing 16-20 (long 50) but he missed 6 xp's. New punter, rF Anson Kelton had a net of 33.6. TCU finished a top-notch #18 and should have another lofty finish despite the loss of KR Brown.

COACHES - Gary Patterson has done a tremendous job here taking over when Franchione bolted prior to the 2000 bowl. Patterson was CUSA's 2002 and the MWC 2005 Coach of the Year. His 73-27 record is the best after 100 games in school history. This year he loses long-time (11 yr) OC Mike Schultz. He brings in co-OC's in Jarrett Anderson and Justin Fuente (RB ch 2Y). Anderson is in his 12th overall year here (WR ch L/8). Patterson was an asst under DC Dick Bumpas at Navy and was able to hire the solid DC away from WM. Bumpas (6th year) was a Broyles Award Finalist last year. Patterson turned down a \$2 mil per year offer from Minn in '06 and had his contract reworked after '08 to an avg of \$1.7 mil. He is now the longest tenured coach in the MWC.

PHIL'S FORECAST

Despite not getting the most highly touted HS recruits, TCU has a great weight training program which builds bigger, stronger and faster athletes. Almost 75% of the roster can bench 400 lbs and each year they appear to be the fastest team in the MWC, especially on defense. After being a member of the SWC, TCU has had some outstanding seasons incl being 10-2 ('02 in CUSA) and flirting with a 2003 BCS bowl berth before losing a late game at S Miss. They have been to a bowl in 10 of the last 11 years with the lone non-bowl season being a 5-6 finish in '04. In 2005 they moved into their 4th conf in 10 years. They had to replace 25 lettermen (MWC's highest) and ret just 12 starters. They were picked 6th in the 2002 CUSA media poll and won that title and 6th in the MWC 2005 poll and responded with a dream season. In the opener they knocked off #7 Oklahoma on the road, the highest rated opp they had beaten S/'61. They then ended Utah's 18 game win streak with a 3 point home win in OT. They achieved their 4th ten win season in 6 years and first outright conf title since 1958 (SWC). They have won a league title in 3 diff conf's in the past 9 years and finished '05 ranked #11 in the AP Poll (#9 Coaches). In '06 TCU's D held TTeach without a TD and increased their win streak to 13 before dropping to 3-2 and out of the polls. TCU won their final 8 including an impressive bowl win and finished #22. TCU was the preseason pick to win the MWC in '07 and their preseason goal was 12 wins and a BCS bowl. Unfortunately they lost 2 key DL's for most of the year and struggled to a 4-4 start but rebounded to go 4-1 down the stretch and despite their 4-4 MWC record, they were +106 ypg (2nd best). From '05-'07 they beat five Big 12 teams. Last year TCU was arguably the best non-BCS team despite their 2 losses. One loss came against Okla (played Nat'l Title gm) only being outFD'd 17-16. Later they took on the MWC's preseason conf favorite BYU and destroyed them at home 32-7. The Frogs were at a disadvantage having to face Utah on the road on a short week and despite a 416-275 yd edge, missed 2 key 4Q FG's and Utah got an 80 yd drive for a TD with :48 for the win. Facing an undefeated Boise in the bowl they had a 472-250 yd edge and should have won easier than their 17-16 final. It was their 4th consec bowl (1st time schl hist) and they faced 4 unbeaten ranked teams during the year. TCU had their highest finish (#7) since 1959 (#7 in '59, #6 in '55, #1 in '38). They had a school record 437 pts and 56 TD's. They were +211.4 ypg in the MWC which was double that of unbeaten Utah (+100.8). TCU did benefit from +13 in TO's and has just 10 ret starters. Their D returns just 4 starters but adds in JUCO Malcolm Williams, has '07 starting NT Kelly Griffin back and could add QB Marcus Jackson. TCU has ranked #1 in the FBS in def 3 of the last 9 years. TCU has 3 tough road games at Virg, Clem and BYU. They could once again be the most talented non-BCS team and 5 of my 9 sets of power ratings still call for them to go unbeaten.

Bonus: The Frogs have now won 68 of 69 games when allowing 17 or fewer pts (3 pt loss to Utah in low scoring gm LY) including 50-1 under Patterson.
TCU is 13-6 vs current BCS teams the last 6 years. The Frogs are 0-1 vs UVA, a 20-10 loss in the '94 Independence Bowl. TCU has won 6 straight season openers.
LY TCU set a school single-season record with 437 pts scored & 56 TD's. The Bobcats went 8-5 LY including a 47-36 loss to SMU but they did make the FCS playoff's.
Coming into '09, TCU is 8-16 all-time vs current ACC tms (1-2 vs Clemson). TCU is 3-2 away vs BCS tms including a win vs #7 OK in '05 & losses to #7 Texas in '06 & #2 OK LY.
SMU won the "Iron Skillet" in '05 after a 6 yr drought in what was TCU's only loss of that year. Since 1995 the home team is 9-4. TCU's avg win has been 25 ppg since '99.
Last yr AF had its fewest yds (161) on the year. It was also their fewest since 142 in '06, vs TCU. TCU has won 5 of the L/6 vs AF but lost 20-17 last time here in OT in '07.
HC Patterson is 5-0 vs Colorado St & winning 4 of 5 by 12+ pts.
LY after allowing an opening 78 yd TD drive, TCU held CSU to just 121 yds the rest of the gm.
TCU has all'd an avg of 430 ypg & 29 ppg to BYU over the L4Y & they are 3-5 all-time vs BYU. LY TCU held BYU to lowest output of ssn (297 yds) & destroyed their "Quest for Perfection".
These 2 first met in '96 when they both played in the WAC & TCU is 6-1 including 4-0 in MWC play winning by a combined 154-37 S/O's. TCU has held UNLV to 25 tll FD's the L2Y.
TCU is 4-0 at Qualcomm Stadium (2 bowl gms, 2 vs SDS) the last 4 years.
Last meeting in '07 here TCU trailed 17-0 before rallying for the 45-33 win.
These high powered offenses have only averaged 36 ppg in their 6 meetings.
The Frogs only win vs the Utes (1-5) was a 23-20 win here in 2005 in OT.
After a 3 pt loss in '07, TCU rebounded with a 54-7 win over the Pokes last year. The Frogs are 3-1 vs the Cowboys in MWC play. The visitor has lost 3 straight.
In 4 MWC meetings, TCU has dominated winning by an avg of 35-13. After opening the ssn vs NM (earliest conf opener ever) TCU & NM signed a contract to play each other in season finales.
Bonus: The Frogs have won 10 of 11 regular season home finales.
