

# IOWA HAWKEYES

## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2009

**QUARTERBACKS** - In '07 Jake Christensen (1 st, 285 yd '06) took over the starting job after Drew Tate departed as the school's #2 all-time career passer. He became UI's first left-handed starter since Phil Suesse (1980). Christensen was sacked 46 times in '07 and was last in the Big Ten in pass eff but took almost every snap passing for 2,269 (53.5%) with a 17-6 ratio. Ricky Stanzi played in 2 (0-4 pass). Last year Stanzi battled Christensen hard in the spring but suffered a shoulder inj in summer. Christensen started the opener but split the snaps with Stanzi. Stanzi started the next 2 but Christensen came off the bench vs Iowa St (Stanzi 5-14) leading them on a 65 yard TD drive for the lead. Christensen started and played the entire 2H vs Pitt, but then Stanzi started the rest of the season. Stanzi threw for 1,956 (59.1%) with a 14-9 ratio. Christensen threw for 396 (57.1%) with a 2-1 ratio. Marvin McNutt (6'4" 215 So) played in 3 (3 pass) but now moves to WR. Redshirt frosh John Weinke (PS#26) and James Vandenberg (PS#56) are the new backups and Stanzi should improve his stats in his 2nd year as a starter.

**RUNNING BACKS** - In '05 and '06 Shonn Greene was the #3 back behind Albert Young (PS#14) and Damian Sims. Young led the Hawkeyes in rushing for 3 straight years with 1,334 (5.4) in '05, 779 (4.4) in '06 and 968 (4.7) in '07. Sims had 664 (5.0) in '06 and 499 (5.0) in '07. Due to acad, Greene spent '07 at a JC. Heading into Aug last year the top returner was WR Derrell Johnson-Koulianos (14 yds!) and the top 2 RB's on the depth chart were Nate Guillory (PS#26JC) and walk-on Paki O'Meara (5'11" 211 Jr). Guillory then transferred in late Aug when Greene returned and won the job. Greene came out of nowhere and was the best RB in the country. He topped 100 every game, took home the Doak Walker Award and set the school record for rushing yards in a season with 1,850 (6.0) and 20 TD's. He was the first consensus AA RB here since Nile Kinnick (1939). True frosh Jewel Hampton (PS#186) had 463 (5.1) and O'Meara added 62 (3.0). Greene opted to leave early for the NFL (#3DC NYJ). Battling Hampton for time will be rfr Jeff Brinson (PS#120) who was impressive on the scout team and Jayme Murphy (5'11" 210 Jr, PS#84DB). Not listed below are Jason White (5'10" 205 rFr), Adam Robinson (5'9" 205 rFr), Tyler Christensen (6'1" 242 rFr) and James Hurt (6'1" 180 rFr). The biggest addition is true frosh Brandon Wegher (PS#5). This unit is more experienced than '08 but I cannot imagine any RB coming near Greene's numbers.

**RECEIVERS** - In '07 the Hawkeyes receiving corps was wiped out by graduation, injuries and susp. Dropped passes were a theme partially accounting for Christensen's 53.5%. Last year they only had to replace their #2 receiver. Derrell Johnson-

Koulianos ("DJK") was demoted to 2nd string prior to Penn St. He responded with 7 rec and went on to lead with 639 (14.5). Andy Brodell (PS#79) had 126 vs NW and was #2 with 533 (14.8). TE Brandon Myers took over for a banged up Tony Moeaki (PS#2) and was #3 with 441 (13.0). Despite playing the season with a broken foot, Moeaki was #5 with 144 (11.1). This year they lose Brodell (13 st) and Myers (13 st, #6DC OAK). Not listed below are WR's Steven Staggs (6'3" 195 rFr), Kyle Steinbrecher (6'2" 201 So), Shane Prater (6'1" 175 rFr, PS#141), Nick Kuchel (5'11" 195 Jr), Don Nordmann (6'6" 211 Jr) and TE's Zach Furlong (6'5" 235 Jr), Jon Gimm (6'3" 235 rFr, PS#29), JD Griggs (6'5" 255 rFr) and Kyle Spading (6'5" 250 Sr). Despite the losses, I look for WR coach Eric Campbell to mold an improved unit.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - Kirk Ferentz was an OL coach in the NFL which means this unit is always one of his top priorities. In '02 he developed what was arguably the best OL in the NCAA. They paved the way for 5.0 ypc rushing (just 13 sk). From '03-'07 they had 7 OL selected in the NFL draft. In '07 Iowa basically had one ret starter losing 2 DC's and a 1st Tm Big Ten G. As you would expect, Iowa struggled with just 126 ypg (3.5) with 46 sacks (12.2%). Last year the entire 2 deep ret'd but ret starter Rafael Eubanks (PS#16) lost his C job to Rob Bruggeman. Dan Doering (last 5 st '07) played in just 5 (inj). The more experienced unit improved to 189 ypg rush (4.8), their best total S/'02. Ferentz called RG Seth Olsen their top OL. This year they lose 1st Tm B10 Olsen (11 st, 3 yr str, #4DC DEN), C Bruggeman (13 st) and OT Austin Postler (1 gm). Not listed below are Tyrel Detsweiler (6'4" 312 So) and Matt Tobin (6'8" 275 rFr). With the return of Dace Richardson (8 st '06), their 99 career starts are 10th most in the FBS. While they probably will not match '08's rushing totals without RB Greene, this unit looks to be as strong as '08.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - In 2007 the D-line had all 4 starters back but were undersized and wore down in the 2H of games. They still improved to allowing 122 ypg rush (3.2) with the D having 27 sacks. Last year they had to replace both DE's (2nd Tm B10 and #4DC) but did have 6 of the top 8 back including perhaps Iowa's best ever DT combo of Mitch King (13 st, 54 tkl, 15.5 tfl) and Matt Kroul (13 st, 57 tkl, 6.5 tfl). King was named the Big Ten DL POY and Kroul set an Iowa record starting 50 consec games (2nd Tm B10). This year they lose their 2 star DT's and DT Anton Narinskiy (2 tkl). They do have a pair of VHT DE's who each started as soph in '08. Last year's D allowed 94 ypg (3.1) but generated just 19 sacks. This year's D-line figures to be softer vs the run but could put more pressure on QB's.

**LINEBACKERS** - In 2005 Iowa had one of the top LB corps in the country but in 2006 they had to replace #1 and #3 DC's. In '07 they only had to replace one starter. Last year the unit was my biggest concern on the team as they had to replace 2 starters including their #1 and #3 tacklers and a backup (2 st). This year the top 6 return including their #1, #2 and #6 tacklers and all 3 are VHT's so this unit is much more experienced and should be one of the top LB corps in the country.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - After 3 straight Top 25 finishes, the Hawks had an exp secondary in '05 but allowed over 60% for the first time ever due to an inexp front 4 and finished #91. Iowa moved up to #49 in '06 and in '07 had to replace 2 starting S's and had 4 frosh in the 2 deep. The Hawks still moved up to #36 with a 13-14 ratio. Last year they had to replace 2 starters (#3DC) but JC Amari Spivey took one spot. SS Harold Dalton (12 st '07) lost his job so they essentially had just one starter back. Surprisingly the inexp unit moved up to #7 (9-23 ratio). This year they lose CB Bradley Fletcher (13 st, 60 tkl, 13 pd, #3DC STL), SS Dalton (2 st, 10 tkl) and Diauntae Morrow (12 tkl). This unit is much more experienced and the new starting CB figures to be VHT Jordan Bernstine (PS#11) who was banged up in '08. However, it will be tough to improve much upon LY's strong #7 finish.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - Ferentz believes his ST unit should be the great equalizer allowing Iowa to contend with teams with superior talent. Heading into '06, Iowa had finished #2, #2, #18 and #20 in my ST rankings. The unit was on par with VT and Ohio St and had 10 blk'd punts from '03-'05. In '06 not much went right and they finished #76. They only improved to #62 in '07 and last year had everyone back but only inched up to #48. Daniel Murray (7-10 long 47 '07) was beaten out by true frosh Trent Mossbrucker (PS#15) who hit 13 of 15 (long 39). Surprisingly, vs Penn St, going into the wind, Murray was called on for the 31 yard game winning FG and made it. Murray reclaimed the job hitting 6 of 9 (long 45) on the year and also had 18 TB's on 80 KO's. P Ryan Donahue (41.6) improved his net to 37.0. Andy Brodell had his PR avg drop from 14.4 to 10.6. Jewel Hampton was the top KR (23.3). This year they only lose Brodell and I'll call for Iowa to have their best ST finish since '05.

**COACHES** - Kirk Ferentz is among the highest paid coaches in the NCAA and was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year in '02 and '04. In '02 he led Iowa to its first Big Ten Title since '90 and also the most wins in school history (11). NFL scouts feel this coaching staff is one of the NCAA's best and there has been little staff turnover. After another round of NFL rumors, Ferentz was given a contract extension through 2015. Ken O'Keefe has been the OC for 11 years. He was the HC at Fordham in '98 and at Allegheny from '90-'97. DC Norm Parker also enters his 11th year. Parker was named the SEC DC of the Year in '97 while at Vandy. He was also a finalist in both '04 and '05 for the Broyles Award.

## PHIL'S FORECAST

Kirk Ferentz got off to a slow start here as he was 2-18 in his first 20. He is 68-35 since that rough start. The 2002 team played in the Orange Bowl (8-0 B10) despite being outFD'd 102-66 in their first four Big Ten games. In '03 they slipped to 5-3 in Big Ten play and in the final 2 were outFD'd 46-24. They managed to pull both out and got their first Jan win since 1959 when they upset Florida in the Outback Bowl. In '04 they had just 9 starters back. They also had a tough Big Ten schedule (no Ind or NW) and suffered numerous injuries at RB. They opened just 2-2 but rallied for 10-2 record incl a bowl win over LSU. That marked their 3rd straight DD win season (#8 AP all 3 yrs!) The '04 Hawks benefitted from +13 in turnovers. In '05 the Hawks had 12 ret starters and were preseason AP #11 but suffered through a disappointing year (7-5) incl an Outback Bowl loss. Heading into '06, Iowa was one of 4 teams to have 4 straight Jan bowls and their 25 B10 wins were the most from 2002-'05. They ret'd 14 starters and had a veteran senior QB but surprisingly after their close bowl loss to Texas, had their first losing season since 2000. Their 31 TO's (-11) were the most S/'89. In Ferentz's first 8 seasons just 32 true played but he had 11 in '07. After going 20-4 vs the Big Ten from 2002-'04 they went just 11-13 from 2005-'07. Arrests and problems on Facebook came up in '07 and '08. Iowa did suffer some tough losses in '07 and after a loss in the finale vs WM, they fell to 6-6 with no bowl for the first time since 2000. While Iowa was 4-4 in Big Ten play, they were -89 ypg (2nd worst). Last year they did not face Ohio St or Mich for the 2nd straight year. The Hawkeyes were actually inches away from contending for the Big Ten Title and in my Regional Magazine article Best Case/Worst Case Scenario I point out that the Hawkeyes could have easily been 13-0 on his losses were by 1, 5, 3 and 3 points! They had a 361-259 yd edge at Pitt and led 17-14 but lost by 1. Against NW they were SOD after having 1st and goal at the NW8 with 1:25 left and had 5 TO's (NW first lead 7:54 left). Versus Mich St they were int'd and fmbld deep in Spartan territory then with 2:16 left, Greene was stopped on a 4th & 1 at the MSU21 as Ferentz passed up the game tying FG. They destroyed Wisc 38-16 and once again vs Ill had 4 drives inside the 12 result in just 9 pt in a 3 pt loss. They did get a fortunate win vs Penn St (trailed 23-14 4Q). Then after getting past Purdue, destroyed bowl bound Minn 55-0 in the final game in the Metrodome. They defeated SCar 31-7 in the Outback Bowl to finish with 9 wins for the 4th time in 7 years. Iowa was +58.1 ypg in B10 play (#4). This year they are even more exp than '08 with 14 ret starters. On the negative side they did benefit from +8 in TO's and had beneficial off and def ypp's (pg 299). Iowa reminds me a little of Alabama of '07 as the Tide had 4 very close losses and could have been unbeaten. This year UI has 4 tough road tests (PSU, Wisc, MSU, OSU) but I give them shot at topping LY's 9 win total.

Iowa is 13-1 all-time vs UNI w/13 straight wins. Last meeting was a 45-21 win in '05. The Panthers lost to BYU LY 41-17 & lost to champion Richmond in the playoffs.

The visitor has lost 5 straight. Iowa has scored 17 or less in 8 of 11 & gained just 240 yds last year, but they've held ISU without a TD for 10 straight quarters.

These schools last met in '98 a 35-11 UA win. Coming into '09, Iowa has gone 15-1 in non-conf HG's including beating #16 ranked Pac-10 foe Arizona St 21-2 in 2003.

Four upsets in the last 7 meetings. Last year Iowa crushed Penn St's National Champ hopes coming back from a 16-7 3Q deficit with a 31 yd FG with :01 left.

Only other meeting with a current SBC team was a 42-0 win last year vs FIU.

Under Ferentz, Iowa is 16-2 vs current non-BCS foes (only 2 losses vs W Michigan).

Iowa is just 2-10 vs UM since 1991 with the wins coming in '02 & '03. The Hawkeyes have dropped 3 straight conf home openers including getting upset the last 2 years.

RB Greene had a career high 217 yds & 4 TD's as Iowa ran over the Badgers. The 38 points scored LY was the most Iowa has scored vs Wisconsin since 1978.

The visitor has lost 9 straight by an avg of 15 ppg since 1996. Last year in the 16-13 loss Iowa was held on 4th & 1 from the MSU21 on their final possession.

Iowa rebounded LY with a 45-9 win after getting upset in back-to-back meetings. The Hawks had a pair of 100+ yd rushers in Greene (115, 5.0) & Hampton (114, 5.2).

Iowa lost 5 TO's (-4 overall) in LY's 22-17 upset loss in their Big Ten opener.

Iowa led 17-3 early but then failed on 4 tries from the 8 in the last 90 seconds.

Iowa is just 1-10 vs Ohio St S'92 including 5 straight losses in the Horseshoe. The avg loss in Columbus is by 20 ppg. Last time here they were outgained 530-137.

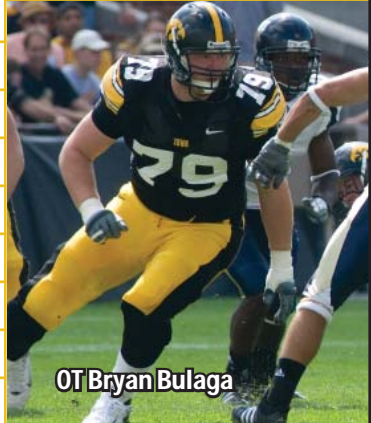
