

MIAMI HURRICANES

POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2009

QUARTERBACKS - In '05 soph Kyle Wright (PS#1) and rFr Kirby Freeman (PS#14) began their battle for the starting QB job. The two combined for three underachieving seasons with the ypg passing dropping each year from 2004-07 (234, 216, 197, 170) with a 16-20 ratio in '07. Their 170 ypg was the lowest in over 20 years. Last year the battle was between rFr Robert Marve (PS#12) who had the strongest arm on the team and true frosh Jacory Harris (PS#7). Also in the mix was Cannon Smith (PS#64) who played at Hargrave in '07 and Taylor Cook (PS#47) but he took a RS. Marve started the entire season (when available, susp 2) throwing for 1,293 (54.5%) but with a 9-13 ratio. True frosh Harris came off the bench late 2Q vs Duke and led 4 TD drives in the final 2.5 Q's. Against UVA Harris threw the TD pass that forced OT and another in OT for the win. He finished with 1,195 (60.8%) and a 12-7 ratio (started opener and bowl due to Marve's susp). Marve opted to transfer. Miami improved somewhat to 197 ypg but had a 22-20 ratio and this unit is more experienced.

RUNNING BACKS - The Hurricanes have surprisingly had just six 1,000 yard rushers (Edgerrin James twice) in their history including their single season leader, Willis McGahee (#1DC), who had 1,753 (6.2) in '02 with an amazing 28 TD's. Miami has not had one since. In 2007 Graig Cooper (PS#62) led with 682 (5.5) while Javarris James (10 as true, led with 802, 4.6), had 582 (3.7). Derron Thomas (PS#51) added 200 (5.0). All of the top RB's were back last year but James suffered a high ankle sprain early and missed 4 (not 100% others). He finished with just 286 (4.2). Cooper led with 841 (4.9) and was also #2 in rec with 29 (#10 in yd). rFr Lee Chambers had 116 (6.4) while Thomas added 111 (3.6). This year the unit only loses Thomas (1 st) and Shawnbrey McNeal (62 yd). Not listed in the PSL below are Damien Berry (5'11" 217 Jr, PS#37DB) who had 114 in the spring game and FB's Joe Lucking (6'0" 230 So) and John Calhoun (6'3" 250 rFr, PS#315). True frosh Mike James (PS#58) was also impressive in the spring. I'll call for Miami to have its best ypg rushing since 2003 (4.6).

RECEIVERS - Miami had to replace 2 of their top 3 WR's LY as the leading returnee was Sam Shields (PS#16RB) who had 346 (12.8) in '07 while TE Chris Zellner had 105 (8.1). They used a lot of true frosh including Aldarius Johnson (PS#9) who led with 332 (10.7). Thearon Collier was #2 with 324 (12.5) and TE Dedrick Epps (PS#24LB) emerged with 304 (13.8) trying to become the next in a long line of Miami TE greats which include Bubba Franks, Jeremy Shockey, Kellen Winslow Jr, and Greg Olsen. Unfortunately Epps tore his ACL in spring and may RS in '09. Travis Benjamin has the best speed of the group and had 293 (16.3) despite being banged up late and Kayne Farquharson (PS#26JC) added 280 (15.6). This year they lose Farquharson (3 st), Zellner (6 st, 14 rec) and Khalil Jones (4 st, 5 rec). Not listed in the 2 deep below are Kris Kimball (5'9" 195 Sr), Jeremy "JJ" Davis (6'0" 194 Sr) and TE's Jimmy Graham (6'8" 255 Sr) and Daniel Adderley (6'6" 225 So, PS#267) who decided not to transfer after Epps' injury. Last year's fine crop of true frosh are now soph and I'll call for this unit to be one of the ACC's better receiving corps.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '06 Miami had just one starter back on the O-line and struggled. At one point then OL coach Mario Cristobal said that the OL play was, "my most painful time of my entire life." UM's rushing ypg was its lowest since 1992 (3.5) and the unit allowed 26 sacks (7.2%). In 2007 they had to replace one starter but had 11 VHT's in the unit. Surprisingly the numbers only improved to 146 ypg (3.7) with 25 sacks (8.3%). Last year they had to replace three starters and one backup. One of the two returning starters, Reggie Youngblood, started just 3 (inj) but they did get the addition of Xavier Shannon (HC's son) who had 29 starts at FIU. Not surprisingly the numbers dipped some to 129 ypg (3.9) and despite having 2 mobile QB's, they allowed 26 sks (6.3%). This year they lose C Shannon (13 st), OT Youngblood (19 car st), RT Chris Rutledge (11 st), OT Tyrone Byrd (1 st) and OL Chris Barney (7 gm). Three full-time starters return as does 1 who had 4 starts. For the first time in the Shannon era, they have a somewhat experienced O-line and should reap the benefits.

DEFENSIVE LINE - Last year Miami had to replace 3 players who combined for 28 starts and then DE Eric Moncur (8 st '07) only started 3 (inj) so they basically had 1 returning starter. The 4.0 ypc allowed (152 ypg) was the highest since 1997. This year they lose DT Dwayne Hendricks (11 st, 48 tk), DT Antonio Dixon (5 st, 31 tk) but have 7 back with starting experience including Moncur (awarded 6th year) and should be much tougher up front. Not listed in the PSL is Gavin Hardin (6'3" 240 rFr, PS#62LB) who was the Scout Tm Def POY LY.

LINEBACKERS - The Hurricanes had to replace their #1 tackler in 2008 (#3DC) and then lost their top LB Colin McCarthy after 4 starts. They did get back Glenn Cook, who was the top LB in '06 but missed '07 with injury, and added the best class of true frosh LB's (PS#s 5, 9, 20, 22, 35). This year they lose their top tackler again in Cook (13 st, 91 tk) as well as Romeo Davis (4 st, 31 tk) and Spencer Adkins (20 tk, 4 sk, #6DC ATL). With the return of McCarthy, this unit looks just as strong as the 2008 version.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - UM has always had an excellent secondary and opened the decade with finishes of #5, #2, #9, #3, #13, #1 and #24 in my pass D rankings. In '07 they had 3 starters back but surprisingly dropped to #53. LY they had to replace 2 starters incl a #1DC but returned '04 and '06 starters who both missed '07. CB DeMarcus Van Dyke (8 st as true) only started 2 (lost job). UM allowed just 166 ypg (51.2%) but had a 15-4 ratio vs a weak slate of opp and finished #66. This yr they lose S Anthony Reddick (12 st, 75 tk, 3 pbu), CB Bruce Johnson (11 st, 29 tk, 5 pbu), S Lovon Ponder (1 st, 15 tk) and CB Carlos Armour (18 tk). FS Randy Phillips (8 st '06, 4 '07) returns (1 st '08, inj). They have 6 back with 6+ career starts and add WR Sam Shields (15 st WR). UM should get back to their accustomed Top 25 ST finish.

SPECIAL TEAMS - The Hurricanes have produced some excellent ST players including Devin Hester and finished #1, #27, #49, #8, #5, #28 and #52 in my ST rankings since 2000. In 2007 they had to replace their P and K and the return game was below avg and they plummeted to #104. Last year they had to replace their K and top PR but as expected, they improved to #33. Two players were key. Soph P/K Matt Boshier (PS#4), who avg 40.2 (35.0 tm net) in '07, avg 40.3 (36.2 net) in '08. Boshier also took over the kicking duties and was a Groza Award semi-finalist hitting 18 of 20 (long 52) and had 6 TB's on 69 KO's. Boshier was named 2nd Tm ACC for both P and K. Speedy true frosh Travis Benjamin avg 11.3 on PR's and 22.5 on KR's. Almost everyone returns so this figures to be one of the top ST units in the country.

COACHES - Randy Shannon is now in his 16th year at Miami and was the DC here for six years prior to taking over as the HC. He fielded fine units each season. He replaced Larry Coker who was 60-15 in six seasons with one National Title but was let go. Four different coaches have accounted for Miami's 5 National Titles over the last 26 years. This year they bring in their 3rd OC in 5 years in Mark Whipple. Whipple graduated from Brown where he was the starting QB from 1977-78. He spent 15 years as a HC (121-59) incl 6 w/UMass taking them to the IAA title in '98. He owns a Super Bowl ring as the Steelers QB coach from 2004-'06 and comes over from the Eagles (NFL). DC Bill Young opted to take the same position at his alma mater Okla St. Miami brings in John Lovett who was UNC's ST coach in '07 and '08 and the DC previously at BG, Clem, Aub and Ole Miss.

PHIL'S FORECAST

Howard Schnellenberger guided Miami to a National Championship in 1983 and UM also won a National Title under Jimmy Johnson (1987) and two under Dennis Erickson (1989, 1991). They had a rare losing year in 1997 due to scholarship reductions but Butch Davis had them pointed in the right direction and in 2000 they went 11-1 and finished #2. Larry Coker guided them to a National Title in his first season and almost repeated the next year when they came up just short in the Fiesta Bowl vs Ohio St. After an 11-2 season in '03, they won 9 games in each of the next 2 years but suffered a blowout loss to LSU in the Peach Bowl in '05. At 6-6 in '06 they needed a 1 pt win over Nevada just to have a winning season. The Randy Shannon era then began. They were unranked in the preseason for the first time since 1998 and went through an up and down 2007. The highs included a 31-0 lead over #20 TX A&M at home (34-17 final) and a fortunate win over Fla St on the road. The lowest of lows was being embarrassed in the Orange Bowl's FHG by Virginia 48-0 (previous worst home loss was to ND 44-0 in 1973). Their 5-7 record was their worst since 1977. The team went 2-6 and was -66.4 ypg (3rd worst) in the ACC. They limped into 2008 12-13 over the previous two seasons but moved into Dolphin Stadium and had 18 seniors in the 2 deep but just 9 returning starters. UM showed great team speed and after whipping an FCS team their young squad only trailed eventual Nat'l Champ Florida 9-3 after 3Q. They beat TX A&M 41-23 on the road but then gave up a 14 yd TD pass with :46 left and lost at home to NC (with a bkup QB). Fla St had a 469-256 yd edge and led 31-10 in the 3Q but UM made it close. The next week they would have shutout UCF but gave up an IR and KR TD. They trailed Duke 24-14 in the 3Q but rallied for a 49-31 win. WF led 10-3 at the half but UM rallied for a 16-10 win, then vs Virginia they rallied for a tying TD in the 4Q and won in OT despite a 448-318 yd edge. They beat VT 16-14 and were in 1st place in the Coastal and ranked (#23) for the first time in over 2 years. On a cold night in Atlanta, they were throttled 41-23 by GT and then were whipped by NCSU on the road in the season finale. After dropping their bowl, they fell to 7-6 making them a .500 team over the last 3 years. This year Miami loses both coordinators. They do qualify for Turnovers=Turnaround as they were -10 in '08. UM was #7 in the ACC in ypg (-15.4). This year 6 of my 9 sets of power ratings call Miami the most talented team in the ACC but they do have a killer schedule drawing the top 2 out of the Atlantic (FSU & Clem), facing NC and VT on the road in the Coastal and playing non-conf games vs Okla and USF. Despite the grueling schedule, I give Miami a shot at a double digit win season.

These 2 opened the season vs each other from '04-'06 & UM is just 1-3 the L/4. Last year the Hurricanes trailed 24-3 & were outgained 286-52 at the half.

UM has dropped 4 straight including LY as GT piled up 472 yds on the ground in a 41-23 rout. Last time here UM led 7-0 at HT but was outgained 244-71 in the 2H.

The Hurricanes are 2-4 vs the Hokies & have topped 16 pts just once since '03. In last year's defensive struggle the teams combined for 497 total yds & 27 FD's.

In the last meeting in '07, UM was mauled, being outgained 411-139 & outFD'd 25-7. UM is 8-1 at home vs current non-conf BCS teams winning by an avg of 21 ppg.

The Rattlers play in the MEAC & went 9-3 last season. The Hurricanes have beaten their last 9 FCS opponents by an avg of 56-9 scoring 49+ pts in each game.

Last year in the first meeting Miami's defense dominated holding the Knights to 10 FD's & 78 TOTAL yds but the Hurricanes allowed a 62 yd IR & a 91 yd KR for TD's.

Miami is 5-2 all-time vs the Tigers. These two last met in '05 & UM needed a Tyrone Moss 25 yd TD run in the 3rd OT to lift #13 Miami over #20 Clemson 36-30.

Miami has won 5 straight in this series by an avg of 28 ppg but LY only won by 6. LY Miami allowed their only TD on the opening drive & held WF to 74 2H yds.

LY QB Harris threw a tying TD pass in the final minute & another one in OT to give Miami a 24-17 win over Virginia. UM is 4-2 all-time in this series but both losses were upsets.

The visitor is 1-8. HC Shannon was a player & assistant under Davis at Miami.

Miami led 14-0 LY but NC went 56/7pl & scored the GW TD w/46 left on a 14 yd TD pass.

Miami scored 35 unanswered points to pull away LY & are 5-1 in this series. Fr QB Harris came into the 2Q & threw for 4 TD's & ran for another last year.

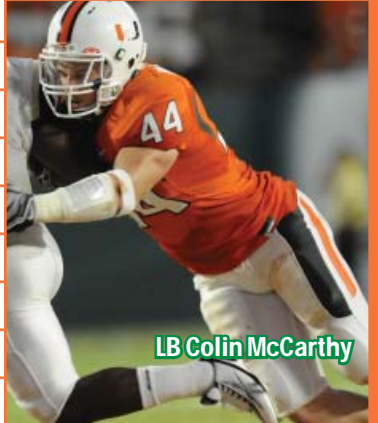
