

TEXAS LONGHORNS

POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2009

QUARTERBACKS - Vince Young had a memorable career here and became the first player in NCAA history to leave 2,500 passing and 1,000 rushing yds in a season ('05) and left 30-2 as a starting QB. In 2006 rFr Colt McCoy (PS#11) beat out true frosh Jevan Snead (PS#4, IFS). McCoy had a much better season than most expected. He set school records for TD passes in a game (6) and season (29). Snead transferred to Ole Miss. During Aug '07 McCoy was getting 50% of the snaps and Sherrod Harris (6'3" 215, PS#23) and true frosh John Chiles (PS#8) were getting 25% each. In 8 of Mack Brown's 11 years, the backup QB has received significant action as the starting QB's stayed healthy in just '02, '05 and '08. Chiles (fastest on team) created the same buzz that Vince Young did 5 years ago and became 2nd string (hamstring inj). In 2006 McCoy had a veteran O-line and while they had to replace 3 OL starters in '07, nobody expected McCoy's sophomore slump. While he narrowly missed the school record for passing yards in a season (Major Applewhite 3,357 in '99), he also nearly set the record for most int in a season (Todd Dodge '84, 19). McCoy's comp % dropped from 68.2% (29-7 ratio) to 65.1% (22-18). Chiles played in 7 but hit just 1 of 9 (191 rush). Last year I expected McCoy to return to '06's form and he surpassed his frosh numbers, completing an NCAA record 76.7% for 3,859 with a 34-8 ratio. He was also the #1 rusher (561, 4.1) and finished 2nd in the Heisman balloting. McCoy turned down the NFL. The Longhorn QB's combined for a Texas record 4,008 passing yards. Chiles hit 11 of 13 for 149 yds and they even used the "Q" package bringing him on the field with McCoy but he now moves to WR. Brown adds in true frosh Garrett Gilbert (PS#2), who is expected to play TY and take McCoy's spot next season. Also adding depth are Trevor Walker (6'2" 197 Jr), Ford Lakin (6'1" 185 rFr, PS#145) and John Paul Floyd (6'1" 180 rFr). McCoy should have his best season as a senior.

RUNNING BACKS - Texas has had some great RB's including Heisman Trophy winners Earl Campbell and Ricky Williams. Cedric Benson became just the 5th player in NCAA history to top 1,000 for 4 straight years including 1,834 (5.6) in '04. QB Vince Young kept alive Texas' streak of 1,000 yard rushers at 11 but the top RB in '05 was Jamaal Charles (PS#6) who had only 878 (7.4). In 2006 the streak ended as Charles led with 831 (5.3). In '07 Charles rushed for 1,619 (6.3) and 18 TDs. Vondrell McGee (PS#20) had 297 (4.0) and Chris Ogbonnaya had 66 (2.5). Last year those two ret'd and Foswhitt Whittaker (PS#18) was the star of the spring game. It appeared to be a 3-man race but Whittaker was inj in Aug. He ret'd in Wk 2 and rushed for 72 but then missed 2. For the season he was never 100% and played in 7 with 284 yd (4.4). QB McCoy led in rushing and the top RB was McGee who had just 376 (4.3). FB Cody Johnson also played TB and had 338 (4.4) and Ogbonnaya for 373 (5.0). This year the only losses are Ogbonnaya (7 st, #7DC STL) and FB Luke Tiemann (4 gm). Not listed below are Tre' Newton (6'0" 200 rFr, PS#29) and FB's Antwan Cobb (6'0" 215 Jr, PS#59), Aaron Smith (6'2" 228 So) and Jamison Berryhill (5'11" 220 rFr). I like the talent here and this unit should greatly improve its production.

RECEIVERS - The top 3 WR's ret'd in '06 & '07 but LY they had to replace 2 of their top 3 rec including their TE. The TE's were banged up and became a non-factor in the off. Their top 2 WR's were clearly Jordan Shipley (PS#7, 417, in '07) and Quan Cosby (PS#9) who was #2 in '07 (680, 11.3). They became UT's first duo to each top 1,000 rec yd in a season. The #3 WR spot was battled for all year by Malcolm Williams (PS#11) and Brandon Collins (PS#46). Not listed below are DJ Monroe (5'9" 170 rFr, PS#27), Brock Fitzhenry (5'9" 171 rFr, PS#79), Phillip Payne (6'2" 215 Jr, PS#24) and TE's Ian Harris (6'4" 253 So, PS#22), DJ Grant (6'3" 215 rFr, PS#140), Ahmad Howard (6'4" 250 So, PS#29) and Mac McWhorter (6'4" 250 Sr). TE Blaine Irby had 10 rec in the first 3 before being lost (inj) and he should

bring the TE back into the off. They lose their top WR in Cosby (13 st, 1123) but Shipley was granted a 6th yr and they add in QB Chiles, making them more exp than in '08.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In 2007 Texas had to replace 3 starters (115 car st!) then lost a pair of starters to injury late in the year. They still avg'd 208 ypg rush (5.0) with 25 sacks allowed (5.7%). Last year they had to replace two starters (one out w/inj) but ret the entire 2 deep from the final 2 of '07. OL Coach McWhorter (AFCA '08 Asst Cch Yr), who has been here since '02, called the '08 group the deepest OL in his tenure. It was surprising to me that even with a mobile QB like Colt McCoy (561 rush) their stats fell to 167 ypg and their 4.3 ypc was their lowest since '02. They had just 1 senior starter on the OL and when starting C Chris Hall went out, true frosh David Snow got in two starts. This year they lose RG Cedric Dockery (13 st, 3Y st'r) and blocking TE Peter Ullman (2 st, 3 rec). The Horns ret 91 career starts (tie #15 FBS) and have 13 VHT's in the 3 deep and should greatly improve upon '08's underachieving numbers.

DEFENSIVE LINE - Despite having 4 ret st'rs in their '05 Nat'l Title year, the DL yielded 131 ypg rush (3.7). In '06 they only had to replace 1 st'r and they had their best rush D S/42 allowing 61.2 ypg (2.3). In '07 despite having just 1 ret st'r, Texas allowed just 93 ypg (2.9). Last year they had to replace two 2nd Tm B12 DT's (one #5DC). DE Brian Orakpo was the star and earned Big 12 Def POY and won the Nagurski, Lombardi and Hendricks awards. Texas allowed just 84 ypg (3.1) with an FBS leading 47 sacks. This year the losses are heavy. Gone are Orakpo (11 st, 42 tkl, 11.5 sk, #1DC WAS), 1st Tm Big 12 DT Roy Miller (13 st, 49 tkl, 5.5 sk, #3DC TB), HM Big 12 DE Henry Melton (10 st, 29 tkl, 4 sk, 6 tfl, #4DC CHI) and DT Aaron Lewis (5 st, 8 tkl). 1st Tm Big 12 Sergio Kindle (10 sk) is the defense's top player and will continue to bounce between DE and LB but this group is clearly my biggest question mark.

LINEBACKERS - Texas splits the playing time at their LB positions. For example, last year the Horns had to replace two starters (comb 125 tkl) but their replacements, Jared Norton (PS#19) and Rodrick Muckelroy (PS#30) had 120 in '07. Last year's lone ret starter, Rashad Bobino, was #4 tkl'r in '07 (69) but only #9 last year (39). This year the only loss is Bobino and while he had 7 starts, I count 3 starters back on the unit as they have their #1, #4 and #5 tkl'rs ret with Kindle and Muckelroy among the Big 12's best.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - After a #6 finish in my pass D rankings in '05, the Horns yielded a school record 236 ypg passing and shockingly dropped to #63 in '06. In '07 they had to replace 3 starters (all DC's) including a Thorpe Award winning CB and 1st Tm Big 12 FS. Their starting CB's were just 5'9" and 5'10" and UT finished #45 allowing a new record of 278 ypg (#109 in FBS!). Last year they once again had to replace 3 starters. I mentioned that the unit actually lost less to the NFL so they were more experienced. They had 5 frosh/rFr on the 2 deep but seven

of the top 8 were VHT's. As you would expect, Texas rose to #19 (faced #1 toughest QB's). This year the only loss is CB Ryan Palmer (2nd Tm B12, 12 st, 32 tkl, 3 int). They have six back with starting experience (3 others with 12+ gm) and I'll call for them to finish with at least 100 ypg less allowed than last year.

SPECIAL TEAMS - With Brown's great recruiting classes, most of the backups are VHT's and contribute here. This decade they have finished #18, #10, #16, #15, #36, #11 (in '05), #12, #26 and #10 in my ST rankings. In '07, Hunter Lawrence had 16 TB's on 91 KO's and Ryan Bailey hit 18 of 22 FG's (long 52). Everyone ret'd LY but Quan Cosby dropped in both PR's (9.4 to 6.3) and KR's (24.2 to 20.6) while Jordan Shipley became the first Horn to score KR, PR and receiving TD's in the same season. Bailey hit just 1 of 2 FG's (inj) and Lawrence hit 10 of 12 (long 46). True frosh Justin Tucker had 23 TB's on 94 KO's. Tucker also handled rugby style P's (1 of 4 P's) and the team's net improved to 39.6. This year they only lose Cosby so another top 25 finish is expected.

COACHES - Mack Brown took over a team that had 3 winning ssn the previous 7 years (4-7 prior yr). He has now won or tied for 5 Big 12 South Titles and has had 19 straight winning seasons overall as a HC including 17 straight bowl bids. He is also the only coach to have 13 straight 9 win ssn. Last year Mack Brown won the Bobby Dodd Nat'l COY Award. OC Greg Davis was with him at N Car and his off has had 9 of Texas' Top 10 seasons in passing yds. They've recorded 35 off team records and 38 fifty-pt games in his tenure. They had co-DC's in '07 but after the D allowed 25.3 ppg (most S/98), Brown made a tremendous hire bringing in Will Muschamp who was the DC at Auburn (2 yr). He was also the DC at LSU from 2001-'04 and the asst def HC with the Miami Dolphins in '05 under his mentor Nick Saban. He guided LSU's Nat'l Title D in '03 (#1 in the FBS). Muschamp will take over as HC when Brown eventually steps down.

PHIL'S FORECAST

Brown came into '05 with just a 1-12 record vs Top 5 teams but things changed in a big way. UT defeated #4 Ohio St on the road and after having lost 5 straight to Okla, won comfortably 45-12. They beat defending National Champ #1 USC in the Rose Bowl winning their first National Title since 1970. In '06 Vince Young decided to leave early for the NFL and they had their 21 game win streak snapped in Wk 2 vs #1 Ohio St. They still knocked off Okla and were #4 with a shot at the National Title Game when QB McCoy was injured and they lost B2B games to K-St and A&M missing out on the Big 12 Title game. They barely got past Iowa in the bowl to finish 10-3. They were 6-2 in the Big 12 but only +43.9 ypg (4th best), a big drop from 2005 (+211.0 ypg). UT had 13 starters back in '07 and while it was a lackluster year with many unimpressive performances (dropped as low as #23), they ended the year #10. They started 0-2 in the conf for the first time S/56 (-1.9 SWC). They had 2 big comeback wins vs Neb and Okla St and scored 24 pts in the 4Q vs TT to move to 9-2, before being upset by A&M in the finale. Brown was determined to win the bowl game and called every starting job open in bowl practices. Texas responded with a 52-34 wipe out of #12 Ariz St getting their 7th straight year of double digit wins. Texas had just 11 returning starters last year and pulled Kansas and Missouri out of the Big 12 North and had to play TT and Okla away from home. It looked like '08 would be a good year but '09 would be the year they contended for the Nat'l Title. Texas dominated five weak foes early. They trailed #1 Okla by 8 early in the 3Q when OU star LB Ryan Reynolds was inj'd and UT rallied for a 45-35 win. They spanked #11 MO the next week (led 35-0 2Q) then barely got past #7 Okla St by 4. They trailed #6 TT 29-13 3Q but rallied for the lead only to have Harrell hit Crabtree for the game winning TD pass with :01 left. They routed their final 3 foes. That brought up a huge debate as to which 11-1 team, Okla, Texas or TT would get to the Big 12 Title game and have a shot at playing for the Nat'l Title. A disappointed Longhorn team still beat #10 Ohio St in the Fiesta Bowl. Texas outgained Big 12 foes by 115.3 (3rd best) and now returns 16 starters. The Horns lose just 12 letterman and I rate them #1 in the Big 12 in 6 of the 9 categories and 7 of my 9 sets of power ratings call for them to have an unbeaten season. If, for any reason, they end up tied with Okla the voters will pick Texas this year.

The Longhorns have won 9 straight season openers with an average score of 49-6. Texas is 13-0 vs current SBC members with a 27 ppg avg margin of victory.

The Longhorns have won 8 straight road openers & 25 of L/29 away from Austin. Under HC Mack Brown Texas is 10-2 in non-conf away games (9-0 since 2001).

Last yr TT WR Crabtree got a TD reception with :01 left for the win. These schools have played every year since 1960 & UT has won 5 of the L/6 (9-4 in Big 12 play).

Texas came out flat LY in El Paso, trailing 6-0 & were outgained in a misleading final. Under Brown, UT is 17-0 vs instate non-conference schools (avg score 47-10).

Bonus: Coming into '09 including bowls, UT is 15-4 vs ranked opponents the L5Y.

Under Brown, UT is 72-16 (82%) in B12 reg ssn play. UT is 6-1 S/00 vs CU (avg W by 31 ppg), but the L in '01's B12 Title gm knocked them out of a National Title shot.

This rivalry had been played every yr at the Cotton Bowl since 1929 (UT 58-40-5). Texas had just -3 yds rushing LY in the 1H before a key OU LB injury (164 yds, 8.2 after).

UT is 14-1 S/31 vs MU with the only L coming in '97 (UT's last losing ssn & yr before Brown). LY QB McCoy set a school record with 17 consecutive pass completions (29-32, 337 yds 2-0).

Last time here UT trailed 21-0 & outscored OSU 24-0 in the 4Q including a 40 yd FG w/o any time left. UT has won the L/11 vs OSU & 16 of the L/17.

Texas trailed 24-23 early 4Q in the schools only meeting in 2007 (in Orlando). Including all 4 non-conf schools, of Texas' 12 opp's TY only 5 went to a bowl LY.

Longhorns are 12-4 since '00 in Nov AG's. This will be McCoy's 4th start vs BU, he is avg 289 ypg (69%) w/12 TD passes, but also has tossed 5 int & been sk'd 5x's.

Last gm hosting KU ('05), UT had a 52-0 HT lead (tied UT rec) holding KU to 13 yds & 1 FD. Texas is 15-1 since 1993 in home finales (only loss was to Texas A&M in 2006).

HT in this instate rivalry is 9-4 in B12 gms. UT is 41-18-2 on Thanksgiving & LY held A&M to -24 yds rushing, posting the largest margin of victory in the series since 1898.

Bonus: Texas is 28-6 the last 34 games in November.
