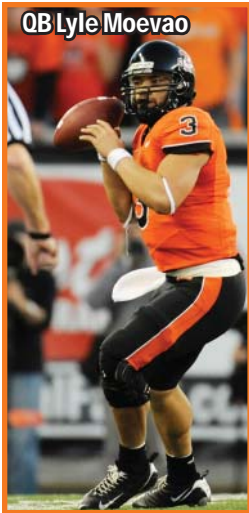


# OREGON ST BEAVERS

## POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2009

**QUARTERBACKS** - A reoccurring theme under HC Mike Riley was that a QB struggles in the first year and gets much better in the 2nd. Derek Anderson had a 24-24 ratio in the 1st year of Riley's second stint at OSU ('03) and improved to 29-17 as a senior. Matt Moore had an 11-19 ratio in '05 but improved to 18-7 in '06 (60.6%). In '07 Sean Canfield (PS#40), who has a strong arm and is a drop-back QB, battled 5'11" JUCO Lyle Moevao (more mobile). They split the job the first 3 but then Canfield took almost all of the snaps over the next 6 until he was injured vs USC. In Moevao's first start vs UW, he hit just 10 of 22 but finished 4-0 as a starter (inj'd 1H bowl). Canfield was not 100% so Moevao was the clear cut starter into '08. He was inj vs Ariz St and Canfield threw for 218. Canfield started vs UCLA and threw for 222. Moevao ret'd vs Cal and hit just 14 of 28 for 145 and then Canfield hit 20 of 32 for 224 in their win over Ariz. Moevao took all the snaps in The Civil War and the bowl and threw for 2,534 (59.3%) with a 19-13 ratio and despite his mobility, he had just 59 gross yds rushing. Canfield threw for 703 (66.7%) with a 6-2 ratio. Justin Engstrom (6'5" 204 So, PS#282) played in 3. All 3 ret this year in a crowded QB field. Added in are Ryan Katz (6'1" 208 rFr, PS#33), Zach Anderson (6'4" 222 rFr, PS#119), Brennan Sim (6'2" 205 Jr), Peter Lalich (6'4" 229 Jr, PS#15) who played in 8 as a true frosh at UVA (321 yds, 57.4%) and Kaulin Krebs (6'0" 193 rFr). Moevao, who battled a shoulder inj in the 2H of '08, is 11-4 as a starter. I looked for improved QB play in '09.

**RUNNING BACKS** - Last year the Beavers had to replace Yvenson Bernard who left as OSU's #2 all-time rusher (3,862) and the leading returning rusher was WR James Rodgers who had 586 (11.7) on fly sweeps. There was zero experience among the top 3 who were rFr Ryan McCants (PS#138), JUCO Jeremy Francis (PS#95) and true frosh Jacquizz Rodgers (PS#23). McCants at 240 lbs is a big, bruising back and began as the starter but "Quizz" exploded into the national consciousness with 186 yd vs USC (more than 5 tms had in total offense vs Trojans). He rushed for 1,253 (4.8) with 11 TD's despite missing the last 2. He had the most ever rush yards by a frosh in P10 history (1 of just 3 to top 1,000). His older brother James was once again #2 (408, 8.9) despite being a WR and McCants had 337 (4.0). Jeremy Francis played in 9 (165 rush, 12 rec), but he left the program. Not listed below are Joshua Parish (5'11" 208 So), Jordan Jenkins (6'1" 205 rFr), Clayton York (6'0" 208 rFr), Chris Roth (5'11" 221 Jr) and FB Will Darkins (6'1" 224 So). While it will be tough to improve much upon Quizz's production, this unit is vastly more experienced.

**RECEIVERS** - OSU has had some fine WR's (see Hardcore). In '06, Sammie Stroughter led with 1,293 (17.5) but in '07 he RS and Anthony Brown (PS#99) led with 550 (14.1). True frosh Darrell Catchings (PS#183) had 386 (11.7). Last year they had to replace their #1 and #3 rec but got a huge boost with Stroughter's ret and also got increased production from James Rodgers (208, 10.9 in '07). He was #3 with 607 (11.9) and also the #2 rusher. Stroughter finished #1 with 1,040 (14.9) and Shane Morales (115, 7.2 '07) added 743 (13.8). TE Howard Croom had his numbers drop from 20 rec in '07

to 6 and Brady Camp led the TE's with 12 rec. This year they lose Stroughter (13 st, #7DC TB), Morales (9 st) and Chris Johnson (1 st, 6 rec). Not even listed below are Aaron Nichols (6'0" 185 Jr), Geno Munoz (6'0" 187 rFr, PS#127), Shawn McGarity (5'10" 164 Jr), HB Joe Halauni (6'2" 254 So, PS#28, 1 st), TE's Devin Unga (6'1" 201 Fr, PS#181), who has ret'd from a mission and Kevin Pankey (6'2" 260 rFr). They lose their #1 and #2 WR and they don't have a player like Stroughter to plug in so are clearly weaker in '09.

**OFFENSIVE LINE** - All 5 starters ret'd in '06 but OSU lost its RT after 3 starts. They were the only team that had all 5 OL starters earn some type of P10 recognition but surprisingly the stats did not improve (118 ypg, 3.5 ypc, 8.2% sacks). In '07 OSU had to replace a 2nd Tm P10 LT but had 8 of their top 10 back. Two returnees were lost (comb 10 st '07). OSU allowed 30 of its 36 sacks after star LG Jeremy Perry was inj'd. The unit still improved to 175 ypg rush (4.2), their best since 2000. Last year they had to replace a pair of 3 year starters but had 3 starters back and OT Tavita Thompson started the L6 after being inelig the first 7. The stats were similar as they paved the way for 158 ypg rush (4.2) allowing 21 sacks (4.7%). This year they lose 2nd Tm P10 LG Adam Speer (13 st, 2Y str), 1st Tm P10 LT Andy Levitre (13 st, 3Y str, #2DC BUF), Thompson (6 st) and C Marcus Henderson (6 gm). This year they have just 2.5 starters back as Mike Remmers started the first 7 before stepping aside for Thompson. I'll call this unit equal to the '08 group.

**DEFENSIVE LINE** - In 2007, OSU had to replace two starters but the D-line had an incredible year. The Beavers led the FBS in rush D allowing a paltry 71 ypg (2.1) with 44 sacks. Last year they had to replace all 4 starters but they were a little more experienced than the numbers indicated. Slade Norris and Victor Butler, the backup DE's, combined for 19.5 sacks in '07 and both ret'd. Riley also had two JUCO's that he RS in '07 and added another JUCO in DT Stephen Pace. The numbers slipped to allowing 131 ypg (3.8), their worst total since 2001, but they did have 39 sacks. This year they lose DT Pernell Booth (11 st, 22 tk), DE Norris (13 st, 57 tk, 10 sk, 8.5 tfl, #4DC OAK) and 1st Tm P10 DE Butler (13 st, 65 tk, 12 sk, 9.5 tfl, #4DC DAL). They have 5 of the top 8 back and add PS#8TE Gabe Miller. While they actually have more exp back, only one ret DL had a sack (Paea, 5). I look for the Beavers to be tougher vs the run but put a lot less pressure on QB's.

**LINEBACKERS** - OSU has had some excellent LB's with six being drafted since 2002. Riley takes a lot of pride in this group calling it the West Coast version of "LB U" saying his LB's all have the ability to rush the passer and drop back into coverage. In '07 all 3 starters ret'd and were a big part of the reason OSU finished #1 in the FBS in rush D. Last year they had to replace all 3 starters and I called the unit my biggest concern on the entire team and the rush D numbers did drop dramatically. This year they lose LB Bryant Cornell (13 st, 61 tk, 1 tfl), Isaiah Cook (17 tk), Dennis Christopher (12 tk) and Casey Noack (14 tk). They do ret 3 of the top 4 including their top LB, 2nd Tm P10 Keaton Kristick.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS** - Last year OSU only had to replace one starter (2 bkup) including prof'd starting FS Bryan Payton (quit summer). Still, with 3 starters back, OSU finished at #12 (#7 '06, #10 '07). S Greg Laybourn was the P10 DPW 3 times. This year the losses are heavy as gone are 2nd Tm P10 CB Brandon Hughes (11 st, 11 pbu, 4Y str, #5DC SD), 2nd Tm P10 FS Laybourn (#1 tk/r, 3 int), HM P10 CB Keenan Lewis (13 st, 4 int, 9 pbu, 4Y str, #3DC PIT), HM P10 SS Al Afalawa (11 st, 2 int, 3Y str, #6DC CHI) and S Austin Hall (1 st, 40 tk). Amazingly, OSU loses 139 career starts and this year's group combines for just 7. Remember in '05 (see Hardcore) when their inexperienced secondary finished #79? This year's unit is even less experienced.

**SPECIAL TEAMS** - In 2006, OSU was #4 in my ST rankings. They lost their P, KR & PR in '07. KR Gerard Lawson fumbled 3 straight vs UCLA and Alexis Serna was just #111 in net punting (31.7) and they plummeted to #83. Last year they had to replace their K & P but Sammie Stroughter (15.7 PR '06) was back as PR

(10.3) and James Rodgers (24.8) and Patrick Henderson (28.1) were dangerous on KR. Justin Kahut hit 16 of 24 (long 47) but was just 4 of 9 from 40+. While he kicked the game winner vs Ariz, he also had a crucial missed xp in that game. True frosh P Johnny Hecker only had a net of 33.1 but was brilliant in the bowl (10-45.0) and finished with 23 punts inside the 20. Surprisingly, OSU rose to #49 and with everyone back but Stroughter, should improve again.

**COACHES** - Mike Riley began the turnaround at OSU in '97 as he inherited a team filled with players recruited for the wishbone. In his 2nd year he guided OSU to its first 5 win season in 27 years. Riley left in '99 to be an NFL HC (SD) but ret'd to Corvallis in '03. Riley is 5-0 in bowls as a HC and 3-0 in bowls as an OC. He also calls the plays on game day. Danny Langsdorf (ex-OC CFL Eskimos) is the OC (5th year). The DC is Mark Banker, who was the co-DC at Stanford in 2002 and the DB coach for Riley from 1997 to 2001.

## PHIL'S FORECAST

Oregon St snapped a TWENTY-EIGHT year streak of losing seasons in '99 and has had solid success this decade even finishing #4 in the final polls in 2000. Reser Stadium has turned into a pit for opposing teams as OSU is 43-12 at home since '00. When Mike Riley ret'd in '03, he inherited a team that went 4-4 in the P10 (+67 ypg). OSU opened 5-1 and made it to their 4th bowl in 5 years. They were +141.8 ypg in P10 play. That was even better than co-Nat'l Champ USC despite their 4-4 mark! OSU whipped NM in their bowl 55-14. In '04 they nearly defeated defending co-Nat'l Champ LSU in OT in Death Valley but opened just 1-4 and were blown out by Cal 49-7. OSU finished 5-1 just to make a bowl and then dispatched ND 38-21 in the Insight Bowl (5th bowl B/Y) despite facing the #1 toughest sched. In '05 they were the only P10 team not to face USC. They suffered some tough losses and in the season finale, needing a win for a bowl, were blown out by #10 Oregon 56-14. Despite their 3-5 conf record, they were +13.7 ypg (4th best) but were -14 in TO's. OSU started 2-3 in '06, suffering blowout losses to Boise and Cal and trailed Wash 17-10 at half. Their season turned around as they rallied for the win and then ended USC's streak of 27 straight P10 wins. They finished 9-4 including a win at #24 Hawaii. In the bowl, trailing by 13, they rallied for a TD and 2 pt conv with +23 left to knock off Missouri. They finished with their 2nd best record in school history (#21 AP). In '07, OSU had 15 ret starters but was -10 in TO's after 5 (2-3). Over the next 6 they were 5-1 and +13 in TO's and they knocked off #2 Cal on the road. If Oregon had been picked for a BCS bowl, OSU would have played in the Holiday Bowl but instead moved down to the Emerald where they beat MD 21-14. OSU finished 6-3 in the P10 (only +3 ppg). Not only did they benefit from not facing some top-notch QB's but they also had 4 net close wins. Last year they had to replace their entire def front 7 and their 10 ret starters were the P10's 2nd fewest. I thought Riley did an exceptional job getting OSU to match '07's 9 wins. First, they had an even better P10 record at 7-2 and were +101 ypg (2nd best). They also faced a tougher schedule than '07 as they had to play Utah and Penn St (comb 21-1) on the road. OSU was also hit hard by inj's by year's end. In the opener, OSU was reaching into the EZ for the potential tying TD vs Stanford when they fumbled for a TB. After being blown out by PSU (45-14) they were 0-2 and did not look good. After beating Hawaii 45-7 they stunned #1 USC 27-21 (led 21-0). The only other time they beat a #1 team was in 1967 (USC). OSU traveled to face Utah the next Thurs and had a 405-337 yd edge but the Utes rallied with 11 pts in the final 1:29 to win. OSU annihilated WSU and UW and got past ASU when the Sun Devils missed a tying 2 pt conv. After beating UCLA, OSU controlled its own destiny for the P10 Title. They got past Cal (IR TD w/31 left, won by 13). They trailed Ariz 17-10 with 4:25 left but got a 24 yd FG on the final play to win. If they had beaten UO, OSU would have been in the Rose Bowl for the first time S/64 but without Quizz Rodgers and with UO off a bye, they were buried by the Ducks, 65-38. In the Sun Bowl OSU was w/o both Rodgers brothers but the D held Pitt to 178 tkl yds in a 3-0 win. They again have just 10 ret starters and benefitted from 2 net close wins. Despite the inj's at the end of '08, OSU beat a Top 10 team for a 3rd straight year and they are one of 10 teams that have finished in the Top 25 each of the L3Y. Their 5 straight bowl wins are the 2nd longest streak in the NCAA. OSU set a schl rec with SEVEN NFL DC's (previous rec was 6 in '67) and should get to their 4th straight bowl.

Vikings went 4-7 LY as a member of the Big Sky Conf including a 48-9 loss to Wash St. Beavers have won 9 of 12 season openers including a 41-14 win vs PSU in '05.

The Beavers are 23-17-1 all-time vs current MWC teams but just 1-3 vs UNLV. Oregon State has dropped their last 6 road openers by a 36-18 avg score.

Despite a 310-229 edge, OSU was hammered 2 yrs ago on the road as Cincy was aided by 7 OSU TO's. The Beavers are 6-8 all-time vs current Big East schools.

LY after hooking the gm-tying XP w/3:58 remaining, OSU K Kahut drilled a 24 yd FG as time expired. QB Moevao missed the gm & RB Rogers missed the last 3Q's.

In their last visit to Tempe, the Beavers blew a 19-0, 1Q lead to the Sun Devils losing 44-32. The road team is just 1-8 while OSU is 4-19-1 vs ASU since 1980.

LY trailing by 8 pts in the final seconds, OSU WR Catchings fumbled into the EZ as he att'd to score the potential gm-tying TD. The Beavers have won 6 of their L/8 vs SU.

Beavers upset USC for the 2nd time in the last 3 ssn LY in Corvallis as USC trailed 21-0 at the half and were unable to convert on a last minute TD att with OSU Safety Laybourn getting the gm-clinching int.

Last year Oregon St HC Riley earned his last career coaching victory against the Bruins as he entered the game 0-9 including 4 losses when he was a DC at USC.

The road tm has won 5 of the L/6 in this series including OSU's upset of #2 Cal in '07. OSU HC Riley began his coaching career with Cal in '75 as a graduate assistant.

Huskies owned this series from '75-'03 winning 25 of the 27 gms vs the Beavers but OSU has now won the L/5 including LY's 34-13 win in Seattle as WR Rodgers tallied 216 all-purp yds & 3 TD's.

In their last trip to Pullman, OSU forced 8 Cougar TO's (7 int) on their way to a 52-17 rout of WSU. The Beavers have outscored WSU by a 118-30 margin the L2Y.

OSU had their Rose Bowl dreams crushed LY in the "Civil War" as UO put up 65 pts & 694 yds in the victory. The road tm in this series had lost 10 straight prior to visiting tm victories the L2Y.
