POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2009



QB Jonathan Crompton

QUARTERBACKS - Tenn has had some fine QB's including Peyton Manning, Eric Ainge (PS#22, #5DC) threw for 3,522 (62.6%) with a 31-10 ratio as a Sr and set Tenn's single season record. Jonathan Crompton played in 7 (1st) in '06 throwing for 401 (47%) with a 4-2 ratio and also played in 7 in '07 (12 att). Crompton won the starting job in '08 but struggled. Crompton fumbled and Auburn rec'd it for a TD in a 14-12 loss and soph Nick Stephens took over. Stephens hit 10 of 19 in a JV game in '07 and hit 10 of 17 for 156 in his first start vs NIII. He threw 2 int vs WY setting up WY's only pts and Crompton retook the job. Stephens did not att a pass in the last 2. RfR BJ Coleman (22 of 31 for 325 in a JV game) hit 4 of 8 for 21 vs Vandy playing the bulk of the game but DNP in the finale. For the season Tenn QB's combined for 1,750 (49.5%) with an 8-9 ratio. Coleman departed after spring, but this unit is more experienced and can ONLY improve on their passing stats.

RUNNING BACKS - Tenn has had many star RB's including Jamal Lewis, Travis Henry and Travis Stephens. After having two 1,000 yard RB's in '04, rfr Arian Foster led with 879 (4.8) in '05. Foster was banged up in '06 and finished with 322 (3.5). LaMarcus Coker (PS#18) led with 696 (6.4). Montario Hardesty (PS#22) added 384 (3.6). The school's 108 ypg rushing was their lowest output S/64. All 3 ret'd in '07 but Coker was susp and later dismissed. Foster finished with 1,193 (4.9). Hardesty (ankle) was never 100% rushing for 373 (4.2). True frosh Lennon Creer (PS#6) was labeled the TB of the future and avg 5.9 ypc but most of his 214 yds came late in blowout wins. Foster was on pace to become the school's all-time career rushing leader but finished #2 as he had just 570 (4.4) in '08. Creer had his best games late and finished with 388 (5.3). Hardesty had 271 (3.6) and true frosh Tauren Poole (PS#51) added 86 (3.9). This year they lose Foster (10 st), Creer (1 st, transfer) and Ja'Kouri Williams (1 gm) but add PS#1 Bryce Brown. Despite the losses, I look for improved production.

RECEIVERS - The Vols had the reputation of being "WR U" as they've produced plenty of NFL WR's. In '07 it was the biggest question mark here as they had to replace their top 3 WR's who combined for 71% of their rec yards with Robert Meachem (#1DC) setting the school's single season record with 1,298 (18.3). While the rec corps was young the top 3 WR's combined for 2,181 which was just 258 less than the top 3 in '06. The biggest difference was that in '06 the top 3 avg 15.3 ypc and in '07 just 11.3. Lucas Taylor (1,000, 13.7), Austin Rogers (624, 11.1) and Josh Briscoe (557, 9.9) all had problems with drops at times as well as injuries. True frosh Gerald Jones (PS#2) missed 5 gm (11 rec) and also lined up in the G-Gun formation at QB. Last year they had to replace their top 2 TE's but did get Ft St transfer Brandon Warren (PS#4). With the inexperienced QB's and new offense, the numbers were way down. Taylor led with 332 (12.8), Jones was #2 with 323 (10.8) with Rogers #4 with 180 (12.9). Soph Denarius Moore (PS#53)

was their big play man and despite just 11 rec, he had UT's only 3 catches of 50+ (271, 24.6). Quintin Hancock (PS#69) was the MIP in the spring but did not catch a pass last yr. This year they lose Briscoe (1 st, 14 rec), Ahmad Paige (transfer), Tyler Maples (transfer) and Taylor (11 st). Despite being a little less experienced, I look for a big uptick in production.

OFFENSIVE LINE - After having an injury plagued group in '06 that opened holes for 108 ypg rush (worst S/64), they had to replace 2 starters in '07 but surprisingly set an NCAA record for fewest sacks allowed with 4 (1%) and opened holes for 139 ypg rush (4.2). Last year they only had to replace starting LT Eric Young (2nd Tm SEC) and 2 backups. When G Anthony Parker turned down an early shot at the NFL they had 62 returning starts in '07. Not much went right for the Vols in '08 as new OC Clawson made changes on the O-line. They now had to play on both sides of the line "quick" and "strong" side scheme. It was still shocking to see the Vols drop to 123 ypg rush (3.6) and surprisingly they allowed 25 sacks (8.1%). This year they lose RT Ramon Foster (12 st, 2Y str), 2nd Tm SEC G Parker (12 st, 3Y str) and OT Ramone Johnson (7 gm). Four return with 6+ starts including 3 super senior VHT's in Josh McNeil (PS#9), Jacques McClendon (PS#9) and Chris Scott (PS#7). Despite not being as experienced as 2008's under performing unit, this group should pave the way for better numbers.

DEFENSIVE LINE - After having inexperienced def fronts for 3 straight years, 7 of their top 8 DL were back in '05 and the Vols (despite a 5-6 rec) were #2 in the FBS in rush D (2.5 ypc). In '06 they had to replace a 3rd Tm AA and two 2nd Tm SEC DE's. The lone returning starter was lost after 3. The Vols allowed 4.1 ypc rush (17 sk), their worst total S/90. In 2007 they had to replace 3 starters (#1, #2 DC's) and allowed 165 ypg rush (4.2). Last year they had to replace 2 starters and one backup (5 st). They still made dramatic strides allowing just 103 ypg (2.8). This year they lose DT Demonte Bolden (11 st, 35 tkl, 6 ftl), 1st Tm SEC DE Robert Ayers (49 tkl, 15.5 tfl, #1DC DEN) and DT Walter Fisher (4 st, 20 tkl, 2 sk). This is a slightly less experienced unit than '08 (see Hardcore).

LINEBACKERS - UT has had an LB selected in the NFL draft in 9 of the last 11 years. In '06 the returning LB's had just 3 career starts. In '07 they only had to replace 1 starter (#1 tkl'r). Last year they had to replace Jerod Mayo (#1DC) who in '07 had the most tackles (140) for a Vol S/88 and one other starter. The top 3 returning LB tacklers were #2, #10 and #13 in '07. This year they lose 2 starters again in Elix Wilson (11 st, 89 tkl) and Nevin McKenzie (8 st, 53 tkl, 5 sk) as well as Adam Myers-White (4 st, 26 tkl, 3 ftl). Rico McCoy has earned 2nd Tm SEC each of the last 2 years. The top 3 LB's back finished #2 and two were tied at #14 in tkl LY.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - The Vols had just one starter back in the secondary in '07 and the inexperienced group dropped to #78 in my pass D rankings. Last year they were in much better shape only having to replace 1 starter (1st Tm SEC, #3 tkl'r) but had Fr AA SS Eric Berry back. They also got the return of FS Demetrice Morley (10 sts '06, RS '07). One returning starter, Brent Vinson (10 st '07) was susp early playing in just 8 (13 tkl). They basically had 2 starters back. Amazingly, in just his soph season Berry broke the SEC career IR ygd record (Bobby Wilson, Ole Miss 1946-'49, 379 yd). He earned 1st Tm AA honors and was my Def POY. The Vols moved up to #23 allowing an 8-17 ratio. This year they lose CB DeAngelo Willingham (12 st, 42 tkl, 3 int), Morley (10 st, 42 tkl, 2 int) and CB Antonio Gaines (3 tkl). Four of the top 6 are back and all 4 have 7+ starts in a season.

SPECIAL TEAMS - Phillip Fulmer's ST units were almost always in my Top 50 and in '07 were #19. Last year most of the key players were back although P Britton Colquitt (36.7 net in '07) was susp the first 5. It was surprising that they dropped to #86. K Daniel Lincoln, who was the FWAA 1st Tm K in '07 hit just 10

of 18 (long 47, 3 miss 50+). Chad Cunningham struggled at P in the 1st 5 gm (39.5) and Colquitt improved his avg to 43.4 (tm net 34.9). Dennis Rogan was solid on KR (24.9). UCLA returned a blocked punt for a TD, the first in the Fulmer era (17 years). This year they lose Colquitt but have most everyone back and should make a good sized climb in my ST rankings.

COACHES - Heading into 2008 Phillip Fulmer had a 147-45 76.6% record which was the best in major college ranks for a coach with 10+ years of service. Fulmer had zero SEC Titles and just 2 Top 10 finishes the last 10 years and was forced to resign after 17 seasons, one year after guiding his team to the SEC Title game. The new HC is Lane Kiffin. Kiffin was the youngest coach (32) in the NFL when he was hired by the Raiders in '07. He was fired by the Raiders after Wk 4. Kiffin had been the OC at USC. His OC is Jim Chaney who was the TE coach for the Rams and a former Purdue OC. While they lose outstanding DC John Chavis, Kiffin made 2 exceptional hires on D. One, his father Monte, who had been the DC for the Tampa Bay Bucs for the last 13 yrs and is one of the best in the game. He also brought in Ed Orgeron as DL coach. He was the former HC at Ole Miss ('05-'07), an outstanding recruiter and DL coach at USC.

PHIL'S FORECAST

Phil Fulmer was the HC here for 17 years and took home a National Title in '98 when his tm went 13-0. Unfortunately in his final 10 years he had just 2 Top 10 finishes and 2 losing seasons. The Vols' 10-3 season in '04 was very misleading. They were 7-1 in SEC play and yet only +14.5 ypg (7th best). I pointed out in my SEC Regional magazine that in the worst case scenario Tenn could have been 4-9 in '04. I did not make a lot of friends in Knoxville in '05. UT was ranked #3 in both preseason polls and was the preseason choice to win the SEC Title by the SEC media. I had them #3 as well but it was in the SEC East as mine was the only magazine that called for Georgia to win the SEC and the ONLY magazine that did NOT have UT in first place. UT lost 4 gms in a row for the first time S/88 as their streak of 16 consec bowls was snapped. Fulmer's previous worst season was '02's 8-5 but they were just 5-6 in '05. In '06 I pointed out many reasons why I thought UT would rebound, among them was that despite their 3-5 SEC mark in '05 they were +28.9 ypg. David Cutcliffe ret'd as OC and they had 7 off starters back. I felt that Ainge would be the most improved QB in the country and I pegged the Vols as one of my surprise teams. UT whipped #9 Cal in the opener and came up a point short vs #7 Florida, beat #10 Georgia and lost by 4 to #13 LSU. They were an inj plagued team that finished #25 at 9-4. They played five Top 13 teams. UT's '07 season reminded me a lot of '04 when they caught a ton of fortunate breaks to tie for the SEC East Title and played in the SEC Title game. After they beat Wisconsin in the bowl they finished the season #12. Despite their 6-2 SEC record, they were -32.7 ypg, the 3rd worst mark in the SEC! Tenn returned 14 starters last year and most Vol fans saw them as a dark horse National Title contender and playing in a Jan bowl at worst. I did not make a lot of friends in Knoxville again when I picked them 4th in the SEC East in '08 and had them playing in the Liberty Bowl. In the opener vs UCLA, Tenn had a 366-288 yd edge but lost in OT. After waxing UAB they twice had a FD inside the Gator 2 in the 1H but fmb'd and were SOD and they trailed 20-0 at half. In '07 they opened 1-2 and won the SEC East so they were still positive but lost a close game to Auburn by 2. They had just a 225-190 yd edge over NI but escaped with a 4 point win. The next week GA had a 458-209 yd edge in the Vols' 26-14 loss. Thanks to a pair of 4Q IR TD's, Tenn turned a 6-3 halftime lead into a 34-3 win over Miss St. Bama dominated them 29-9 and then SC rolled them 27-6 and Fulmer was let go. Shockingly, WY opened their 266-219 and pulled the upset in Knoxville, 13-7. Tenn did rebound vs two teams they beat yearly in Vandy and Kentucky (comb 48-20) sending Fulmer out on a winning note. They were 3-5 (5th East) and were -34.5 ypg (5th worst SEC) with 2 net close losses. Kiffin has rattled the cages of a lot of opposing coaches this offseason. Even in their miserable 5-7 season, a little known fact is that the Vols were tied with Bama at #3 in the country in defense

The Volunteers have won 14 straight home openers by an avg of 22 ppg. First meeting. Vols are 5-1 vs current Sun Belt tms with their only loss to NT in '75. UT is 7-5-2 all-time vs UCLA winning 4 of the last 6 but lost 27-24 in OT LY despite a 366-288 yd edge. UT's D grabbed 4 int's in the 1H including a 61 yd IR TD. The Vols have avg'd just 41 rush ypg vs UF the last 3 years (-11, 37, 96). Tenn has now lost 4 in a row despite outgaining UF LY 258-243 in a 30-6 loss. First meeting. UT is 4-0 vs current MAC schools with an avg win of 33-13. Last year the Vols squeaked past MAC member NI 13-9. Vols are 12-2 after UF. Tenn has lost 4 in a row in this series. LY UT lost 14-12 & was held to 191 total yds. Last year the teams combined for 29 drives with 20 going for 4 plays or less. UGA has won 6 of the last 9 in this series, but UT has won 3 of the last 5. Last year UT was held to 1 yd rushing & UGA had a 458-209 yd edge in their 26-14 win. The visitor is 1-4 the last 5 in this rivalry traditionally played on the 3rd Saturday in October. The Volunteers are 5-1 off a bye the last 3 years (4-0 in the reg season). Tennessee is 21-4-2 all-time vs the Gamecocks, but lost LY. Last time here Tennessee led 21-0 at half time & was outgained 338-62 in the 2H but survived & won in OT. The Vols have never lost a home game vs current members of CUSA (34-0). UT is 20-1 vs Memphis winning the last 5. UT posted a 41-7 win in the last meeting in '06. UT is 43-18-1 all-time vs UM winning the last 12. For many years this series was played in Memphis or Jackson (MS) & as a result, UT has never lost in Oxford (3-0). Tennessee has won 25 of the last 26 in this series & are 68-9-2 since 1928. The Vols had a 222-25 yd edge on the ground in last year's 20-10 win by UT. Tenn has won 24 in a row for the Nation's longest series win streak & 26 straight regular season finales. Last year the Vols sent HC Fulmer out a winner, 28-10.
