QB Sam Bradford



POSITION OUTLOOK FOR 2009

QUARTERBACKS - Jason White won the Heisman here in 2003. In his final two years he threw for 7,051 (63.4%) with a 75-19 ratio. In 2007 rFr Sam Bradford (PS#20) battled JUCO Joey Halzle (2 at '06) and true frosh Keith Nichol (PS#7, in for spg). I projected Bradford to win the job and he had a phenomenal season leading the FBS in pass efficiency. At 6'4", he is the tallest QB to start at OU and has a powerful arm. He threw for 3,121 (69.5%) with a 36-8 ratio. Last year I wondered if he would suffer the same soph jinx that Texas' Colt McCoy did (29-7 ratio in '06, 22-18 in '07) but he did not. Bradford set an NCAA record for pass eff in a season at 180.8 and took home the Heisman Trophy setting various school records. He threw for 4,720 (67.9%) with an amazing 50-8 ratio. Halzle played in 10 (30 passes). This year Halzle departs and the backup is Landry Jones (PS#3). Adding depth is John Nimmo (6'2" 207 Jr) and Ben Sherrard (6'4" 213 rFr, PS#247). Bradford shockingly turned down the draft to return. It will be tough to top '08's numbers, but he could.

RUNNING BACKS - In 2004, Adrian Peterson (PS#1) rushed for a school record 1,925 (5.7) in just 8 starts as a true frosh and was #2 in the Heisman voting, the highest finish ever for a frosh. Peterson was banged up the next 2 years but still managed to top 1,000 each season. He left early for the NFL (#1DC, 7th pick) where he has had two outstanding seasons with the Vikings. Allen Patrick (PS#50JC) did well as Peterson's backup in '06 rushing for 761 (4.5) and Chris Brown added 343 (4.9). Those two both ret'd in '07 but DeMarco Murray (PS#5) was the most explosive of the RB's and was the leading rusher (764, 6.0) but was lost for the ssn vs TT while trying to recover an outside kick. Patrick rushed for 202 vs Okla St and topped 1,000 (1009, 5.8). Brown added 611 (3.9) while Mossis Madu (6'0" 196 Jr, PS#149) had 232 (5.8). Last year they had to replace Patrick (#7DC) and Murray showed his form in the 2H of the year rushing for 1,002 (5.6) with 14 TD's despite missing the last 2 (was #1 when inj'd). Chris Brown finished #1 with 1,220 (5.6) and 20 TD's while Madu added 475 (4.1). All 3 returned as does 1st Tm B12 FB Matt Clapp (6'3" 234 Sr, PS#30) and added to the mix is rFr Jermie Calhoun (PS#2), Justin Johnson (6'1" 200 So, 27 tll yds, PS#12) and FB Buck Buchanan (6'0" 229 So). This is one of the best RB corps in the country.

RECEIVERS - In 2005 OU had to replace 3 NFL DC's including Mark Clayton (#1DC) who is their all-time leading receiver. True frosh Malcolm Kelly led with 471 (14.3). In '06 Kelly had 993 (16.0). Juaquin Iglesias added 514 (12.5), Manuel Johnson (PS#14) had 378 (10.5) and TE Joe Jon Finley added 241 (12.7). The group ret'd intact in '07. Interestingly TE Brody Eldridge (8st, 3 crd '06) was on the preseason Mackey Award Watch List but most of the talk was about

TE Jermaine Gresham (PS#3) who avg 20.1 on 8 rec as a true (2 st). Iglesias led with 907 (13.3) while Kelly added 821 (16.8). Gresham, who bulked up to 250 lbs while also getting faster, had 518 (14.0). Last year they had to replace Finley and Kelly (#2DC). Iglesias led with 1,150 (15.5). Gresham added 950 (14.4) and rFr Ryan Broyles (PS#41) contributed with 687 (14.9). Manuel Johnson added 714 (17.0). This year they lose 2nd Tm B12 Iglesias (14 st, #3DC CHI), Johnson (13st, #7DC DAL), Quentin Chaney (PS#28, 504, 17, 4) and TE Kolby Smith (1 rec). Not listed below are WR's Rashad Hutchins (5'10" 180 So), Zac Givens (5'11" 180 Jr) and TE's James Toms (6'4" 235 rFr), Josh New (6'3" 235 So) and Trent Ratterree (6'4" 232 So). RB Madu will also work at WR. This unit has plenty of talent but is less experienced than last year's top-notch group.

OFFENSIVE LINE - In '06 OU had to replace 4 starters but still opened holes for 177 ypg rush (4.5) and allowed just 16 sacks (4.7%). They did have a mobile QB in Paul Thompson. They had five back with 7+ starts in '07 and avg 191 ypg (4.7) with 14 sks (3.5%). Last year OU had the best OL in the country with 130 career starts (#1 FBS) and all 5 starters were NFL prospects. Surprisingly the Sooners numbers only climbed to 199 ypg (4.7) with 13 sacks (2.5%). This year they lose 1st Tm B12 LT Phil Loadholt (13 st, 2Y str, #2DC MIN), 1st Tm B12 LG Duke Robinson (12 st, 3Y str, #5DC CAR), 2nd Tm B12 C Jon Cooper (14 st, 4Y str), HM B12 RG Brandon Walker (14 st, 3Y str), RT Brannon Braxton (1 st) and backup C Jason Hannan. They add in LSU transfer Jarvis Jones (PS#37, 7 gm true) but only have 32 car starts returning (#107 FBS) with 29 of those belonging to LT Trent Williams. This unit is my major concern on this year's Sooner squad but the last time they had just one starter returning, the stats were very similar ('06) to the '08 numbers.

DEFENSIVE LINE - From '04-'06 OU allowed under 100 ypg rush. In 2007 they had to replace four starters including a pair of 1st Tm Big 12 DL's. The Sooners were the only team in the country to have two PS#1 DT starters in DeMarcus Granger and Gerald McCoy. The inexperienced group still allowed just 110 ypg rush (3.3) while DE Austin English led the Big 12 with 9.5 sacks. Last year they only had to replace 2 players (comb 11 st, 27 tkl, 3 sk). Granger was far from 100% all year due to an injury so it was like having 2 starters returning in McCoy and English. OU slipped a bit allowing 116 ypg (3.5), their highest this decade but the D did have 42 sacks (T#3 FBS). This year they figure to have one of the top DL's in the country and amazingly McCoy turned down being a 1st Rd DC. The only two losses are DE Alan Davis (10 tkl, 2.5 sk) and DT Cory Bennett (12 tkl, 2.5 sk). In my PSL below I list 4 VHT frosh newcomers and they add in Jonte Bumpus (6'3" 226 So, PS#33LB), Casey Walker (6'3" 285 rFr, PS#119) and Tola Jimoh (6'1" 230 Sr).

LINEBACKERS - Last year this unit had to replace their #1 (#2DC) and #2 tacklers and the top returnee was Ryan Reynolds (#7) who was another year removed from his ACL surgery. Reynolds became OU's top def player but was injured vs Texas with the Sooners up by 2 scores. It took the Sooner's D about 4 games to recover from his loss. Also inj'd was proj'd starting WLB Austin Box (miss 4). Travis Lewis had 144 tackles (breaking Brian Bosworth's OU frosh record) which was the 4th most in the FBS LY and Keenan Clayton was #3. Adding depth are Daniel Franklin (6'3" 220 rFr, PS#50), Brandon Crow (6'0" 228 Jr, PS#69, 8 tkl 2Y) and Dylan Hughey (6'0" 210 rFr). This year the only loss is Lamont Robinson (PS#25, 4 tkl) and not only are 5 of the top 6 back but Reynolds returns from injury and 10 of the top 12 are VHT's.

DEFENSIVE BACKS - The Sooners always fare well in my pass D rankings and even with a young, inexperienced unit in '04 they were #29. They moved up to #16 in '05 and to #5 in '06 with 3 starters back. In '07 the unit ret'd intact but "only" finished #18. Last year they had to replace 3 starters who were PS#2, PS#6 and PS#7. Their 1 returning starter, SS Nic Harris even started one game at LB. The less experienced unit actually improved to #11. This year they lose 1st Tm B12 SS Harris (14 st, 75 tkl, 6 pbu, #5DC BUF) and 2nd Tm B12 FS Lendy Holmes (#2 tkl'r, 5

int, 3Y str). Not listed below are Sean Edwards (5'8" 156 So), Marloe Prince (5'11" 175 Sr), Michael Hayes (5'10" 190 Jr) and Emmanuel Jones (5'11" 190 Jr). It surprises me that 2 of the 4 proj starters are non-VHT's but this group has more experience.

SPECIAL TEAMS - In Stoops' first 9 years his ST units were a strength with six Top 13 finishes including '07 when they were #6 in my ST rankings. Last year KR's DeMarco Murray (27.6) and Juaquin Iglesias (23.8) were back as was PR Ryan Broyles (9.9). The team's net punting dropped (37.1 '07 to 33.7 in '08). Jimmy Stevens hit 8 of 12 FG's (long 42). Matt Moreland had 15 TB on 122 KO but the Sooners allowed 4 KR TD's (23.8). OU plummeted to #101. This year they lose P Knall and career KR leader Iglesias but I would expect Stoops to get this unit fixed and back towards the top in my ST rankings.

COACHES - Prior to Bob Stoops' arrival, Oklahoma had five consec non-winning seasons. Stoops not only won a National Championship in his second season but played in the National Title game in each of the next two years. OU's 102 wins the last 9 years are 5 more than any other team in the NCAA. Kevin Wilson, who was the OC at Northwestern from 1999-'01 and had been the co-OC at OU from '02-'05, took over as the sole OC in '06. He is now the co-OC again along with Jay Norvell. Norvell was the OC at Neb from '04-'06 and at UCLA in '07. Both DC's, Brent Venables and Bobby Jack Wright (5th year as co-DC) enter their 11th year here.

PHIL'S FORECAST

In 2000 Okla did not have a single starter miss a single game due to injury. They stunned the nation winning the National Title despite not being ranked in the preseason Top 20. Thanks to a regular season-ending loss to Okla St in '01, the Sooners did not get to the Big 12 Title game. They ret'd to the Big 12 Title game in '02. In 2003 the Sooners lost the conf title game and also the National Title game. The Sooners probably had their most talented and experienced team yet under Stoops in '04. They went 12-0 getting to the Nat'l Title game vs USC but were embarrassed 55-19 in the school's worst loss S/97. In '05 they had just 9 ret starters and topped my NFL Draft Day Party Hangover list with 41 pts (pg 308). They were also #12 in my experience ratings in the B12. RB Adrian Peterson was banged up early and Stoops, who had never lost a non-conf HG, amazingly had a streak of 19 straight home wins snapped in a 17-10 loss to TCU. OU struggled through a 7-4 reg ssn and even needed 2 OT's to get past Baylor at home. OU finished on a high note knocking off #6 Oregon in the Holiday Bowl. Their offense had amazing balance with 2,130 rush and 2,131 pass. In '06 they suffered some tough losses (Oreg & Boise) but still took home the B12 Title and their +98.7 ypg was #1 in conf. In '07 they only had to replace 10 lettermen yet just 2 preseason magazines called for OU to even win the South! Okla was stunned by Colo the week before playing Texas but after they beat the Horns they moved up to 9-1 and #3. They had to travel to TT and Bradford was lost in the 1Q to inj and they lost. They still whipped #1 ranked Missouri in the B12 Title game. "Big Game" Bob suffered his 4th straight BCS bowl loss as WV manhandled them 48-28 in the Fiesta Bowl and they finished #8. Heading into '08, 4 of OU's last 7 losses had come on the final play. Despite winning the B12 they were just +35.5 ypg (5th best) in '07 and did benefit from +8 in TO's. Last year I rated Okla my #1 off and #2 def. The season was going along as planned with 5 blowout wins and they were #1 when they faced #5 Texas. OU led early by 8 in the 3Q but lost their star LB Reynolds to inj and Texas rallied for a 10 pt win. Okla crushed their final 6 foes and when they beat Missouri 62-21 in the Big 12 Title game, it was their 5th straight game of 61+ pts (6 straight 58+). There was much debate as to whether OU or the team that beat them (Texas) deserved to be in the Title game but OU got the opportunity to play Florida and lost by 10. Stoops' 5th straight BCS bowl loss and 3rd straight loss in the Title game. OU was a league best +159.0 ypg and have the nation's longest home win streak at 24. They unexpectedly had 3 key players in QB Bradford, TE Gresham and DT McCoy turn down probable #1DC's. On the negative side, Okla benefited from +23 in TO's. OU has to play BYU, Miami, Texas, Kansas, Neb and TT all away from home but they have my #3 rated off and #5 D in the FBS and 2 of my 9 sets of power ratings call for them to be defeated.

OU has gone 10-1 in ssn openers S/'98 & has won 9 of 11 road openers (lost 2 of L/4). This gm will be played in the new home of the Dallas Cowboys which seats 80,000+.

Coming into '09, under Stoops OU is 32-4 in reg season non-conf gms (L's to UO, TCU, UCLA & ND). Stoops has started the ssn 4-0 in 7 of his 10 yrs as HC (3-1 twice & 2-2 once).

The Sooners lead this instate series 15-7-1, but S/'79 OU has gone 9-1 outscoring the Golden Hurricane by 32 ppg. Last gm in '07 saw a combined 83 pts & 951 yds.

OU played UM in Miami at the old Orange Bowl ('88), both were 11-0 (OU lost 20-14). Under Stoops, OU is 9-2 vs BCS non-conf tms in the reg ssn w/an avg score OU 40-23.

Oklahoma is 24-0 since 2002 when hosting Big 12 opp's (avg score 44-16). Stoops' OU squads have outscored Baylor on avg 43-12 ppg (18-0 all-time).

Since '98, every RRR has been decided by DD except for '07's 7 pt win. OU was up 21-10 mid-2Q LY before MLB Reynolds left w/a knee inj, then the Horns exposed the middle of the field.

OU had 252 yds in the 1Q LY vs KU, breaking the previous best of 235 in 1953. QB Bradford threw for an OU record 468 yds (previous-Josh Heupel 429 yds in '99).

OU's 55 1H pts LY vs KSU tied a school rec for pts in a half (55 in 1942, 2H vs KSU). Stoops was a co-DC/DB coach under Bill Snyder at KSU from 1989-1995.

Oklahoma is 20-2 since 2003 in November. Last year they exploded for a 28-0 lead in the first 5:30 min. OU has won 5 of the L/6 including the 2006 B12 Title game.

Sooners scored a ssn high 66 pts LY vs A&M & they broke a NCAA rec w/5 straight 60+ gms. OU is 9-1 S/'99 vs A&M & the only L was in '02 at Kyle Field when ranked #1.

Bradford tossed 4 TD passes LY vs TT breaking Jason White's single ssn rec of 40. OU has dropped their L/2 trips in Lubbock and 3 of the L/5 (avg score OU 32-27).

This is the most lopsided series in the nation featuring 2 tms from the same state (OU 79-17-7). Last year's Bedlam win sealed Oklahoma's 7th Big 12 South Title.

Bonus: OU is 8-1 S/'00 before taking on rival Texas with an avg MOV of 25 ppg.
